



We also have Lunch Parties, the second Wednesday of every month, which includes a hot meal and entertainment for \$16.00 a person.



Heating Assistance Program

Residents who struggle with their home heating bills can apply for assistance from the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps individuals and families pay their heating bills through home heating energy assistance grants. It also provides crisis grants to help in the event of an emergency or if a resident is in danger of losing his or her heat due to broken equipment, lack of fuel or termination of utility service. The income eligibility guidelines for LIHEAP are set at 150% of the federal poverty income level. For example, the income limit for an individual is \$19,140; for a couple, the limit is \$25,860; and for a family of four, it is \$39,300. Residents may apply for LIHEAP online or by contacting the Bucks County Assistance Office. You may also call the Statewide LIHEAP Hotline at 1-866-857-7095 or call PA Relay at 711 for the hearing impaired.

- 2. Tabs from pop top cans (soda) are being collected for the Ronald McDonald House, which shelters families of children who are seriously ill or injured. We give them to the Women's Club who takes them to a McDonald's repository.
- 3. Both our choral group "The Sunshine Singers" and our band "The Impossibles" go to different nursing homes and assisted living facilities to entertain those residents every month.
- 4. Please bring in any post-marked stamps to the front desk. We collect cancelled stamps, and they are given to the Blind Association.
- 5. The V.A. Clinic in Allentown has a little coffee room available to patients while they wait for their appointments. They need sugar, tea bags, artificial sweeteners and stirrers.
- 6. We are collecting pennies for Cancer Research. Please bring your pennies and loose change in to help.
- 7. Our Volunteers distribute our newsletter throughout the Upper Bucks Area.
