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

BOLTON HISTORY

Dog Days

March is dog license month in Bolton; a yearly tradition that began 164 years ago. Licensing dogs originally stemmed from the need to protect farmers against the loss or damage of livestock or other animals from dogs, as well as a way to control the spread of "canine madness" (rabies). Being a rural farming town, Bolton was in need of such laws and voted so in 1858. The new bylaws called for the selectmen to grant licenses at \$1.00 per dog per year, required all dogs to wear a collar with an identification tag attached, and prohibited dogs from roaming free (muzzles were to be

provided for dogs who did so). A committee of five men was even established to enforce the muzzling of stray dogs. The first person to license his dog in Bolton was Roswell Barrett, followed by 45 others. An 1859 document lists Bolton's dog owners, along with each dog's name, sex, age, and breed. The first dog on the list was a male named Sport, who was owned by Silas Holman.

Dog licenses today cost \$10.00 for male dogs neutered or female dogs spayed; \$15.00 if not.
