# WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

**Confession for those with mobility issues.** One disadvantage of having confessions in the sacristy behind the Mary altar is the stairs; not everyone manages stairs well. For the benefit of these folks, effective immediately, I'll hear confessions – on Thursdays at 3 p.m. – in the main sacristy, which is just off the main vestibule, toward the street entrance of church. I realize it's a little further from the ramps on the side of church, but I'm not sure what else we can do. Let's give it a try, and if you have any thoughts about this, I always want to hear them.

Of course, you might wonder, why not have confessions in the main sacristy more often? The reason is that most confession times are right before Mass, or right before Thursday Benediction, or just after Mass – and there is a lot of traffic and activity in the main sacristy. It's easier to avoid traffic and busyness in the Mary sacristy.

**So why don't we just use the confessional?** The answer is that the confessional is a very tight space, and there is absolutely NO ventilation—and that is simply an unnecessary risk with the virus. I wish we could find a way to create ventilation in the confessional. If you have a suggestion, let me know.

**Do's and Don'ts and Confession etiquette.** A priest friend of mine sometimes shares this sort of thing on his blog, so I thought I'd share some pointers here, especially as it seems like more people are coming to confession – which is wonderful! – but it also means longer lines.

Tell your sins, not the stories.

Confess your sins only, not those of your family, coworkers, and others.

Confession is not the same as counseling. I am very happy to make appointments with people who are wrestling with problems or decisions, but confession isn't the place to try to do this.

Do remember others are waiting – or will arrive after you go in.

Don't wait until the time for confession is nearly over. Confession ends when it ends for good reason – the priest (usually me) has other obligations, often including getting ready for Mass. We have six hours of confession every week, and many more hours during Advent and Lent—and I will gladly make appointments upon request.

Prepare for confession with an examination of your conscience before coming in to make your confession.

When you have finished confession, it is helpful to the priest if you say, "These were my sins" or something like that, because if you fall silent, I don't know if that's a pause while you think further, or you are simply finished and now waiting for me to say something.

Don't agonize! God does not expect you to have perfect recall, or perfect evaluation of your sins. He looks for penitence, not precision.

Don't forget to shut the door coming in, and be sure to leave the door open when you leave.

Do give yourself some time, if possible, after confession to give thanks, and to consider any resolution you may want to make, including perhaps making repairs, apologies, and so forth.

Do try to cultivate a regular habit of confession if you can – every two weeks, once a month, or perhaps quarterly. True, the bare minimum is once a year, but when do we ever say of something that we know is good for us that we'll only do the bare minimum? With showering? Brushing our teeth? Exercise?

If you have children, do bring them to confession, do tell them they are to go. Again, same with brushing teeth; they aren't going to acquire the habit by magic, but by parental pushing. Do not underestimate the power of your example, either of going frequently to confession...or not.

**Keeping calm and being thankful.** Between concerns about Covid and continued uncertainty about the election, a lot of people have high anxiety and even anger. Some things we have no power over, try as we might. The world is going to go along as it does, whether you and I like it or not. We do what we can, then we get on with it. Here's a balm that can help: take time to do an inventory of everything for which you are thankful. For all that happened this year that was unwelcome and disruptive, look for what happened that was beautiful. And remember, God's grace works through everything.

## Americans Should be Praying for Donald Trump and Joe Biden

Questions and controversy continue to swirl and simmer in America's political world. While television networks have projected former Vice-President Joe Biden president-elect, President Trump and his campaign have filed numerous lawsuits in key battleground states alleging widespread voter fraud. It's likely that many of these matters won't be resolved for several weeks, though as states begin certifying results and the Electoral College vote looms in early December, resolution remains on the not too distant horizon. In the meantime, what are we to do? **PRAY!**

Pray for Donald Trump and Joe Biden. The Scriptures are clear that we're to pray for our leaders, regardless of party or position. It was the Apostle Paul who urged citizens to offer "supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings...for kings and all who are in high positions" (1 Tm 2:1). But I love the rationale he offered

for doing so, "that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Tm 2:2-4). In other words, by praying for those in authority over us, our prayers and petitions are not just benefiting them—but we're inviting God to bless us.

It's not easy to pray for someone you don't like—or someone you feel is dangerous and an anathema to the Christian faith. But pray for them anyway. "Honor everyone," wrote Peter. "Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor" (1 Pt 2:17). Writing to believers in Rome who were under constant threat of persecution, Paul wrote, "Let every person be subject to the governing authorities" (Romans 13:1).

Both Mr. Trump and Mr. Biden are carrying significant burdens. It may sound like a cliché to say the weight of the world is on their backs, but the complexities and challenges facing us remain heady and substantial. Regardless of your party or partisan loyalties, I hope you will join me in praying for both of these men and their families.

Pray for truth and justice. Pray for wisdom and discernment. Pray for insight and perspective. Pray that they will seek the Lord and honor His principles as they navigate these next weeks and months. Prayer changes things. It changes people. It can change countries.

In May of 1776, in the midst of the Revolutionary War, with the prospect of a fledgling nation hanging by a thread, General George Washington urged his troops and the nation to pray and fast. They were being outgunned, outmanned, and outmaneuvered. By late summer, the American troops found themselves trapped on Brooklyn Heights in New York. Defeat at the hands of the British seemed inevitable. Escape provided their only chance of survival, but they were surrounded. Washington and his men prayed. By morning, a thick fog had settled over the East River, allowing the troops to escape across to Manhattan Island. Had it not been for the fog, the American troops would have been captured and George Washington hanged. The American Revolution would have been lost.

Metaphorically, fog is often portrayed as a handicap, a phenomenon that blocks our view and confuses the way forward. But God uses all things for good for those who love Him (Romans 8:28), so I remain hopeful that He is using the political fog of today in some way to shape and mold us for His purposes tomorrow.

Thank you for lifting America and Mr. Trump and Mr. Biden up in prayer.

## George Washington's Thanksgiving Proclamation

I don't always understand the things that happen in life, especially in 2020. I don't attempt to offer simple explanations to difficult circumstances. But I can choose to be thankful for something every day. Being thankful helps me to appreciate what I have. Being thankful helps me to have a better perspective. Being thankful helps me to be less anxious. Being thankful gives me a sense of peace. Being thankful helps me to be more content. Being thankful helps me to be more generous. I'm especially mindful of George Washington's Proclamation of 1789:

*Whereas it is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey his will, to be grateful for his benefits, and humbly to implore his protection and favor—and whereas both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts that many signal favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness.*

*Now therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday the 26th of November next to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be—that we may then all unite in rendering unto him our sincere and humble thanks—for his kind care and protection of the People of this Country previous to their becoming a Nation—for the signal and manifold mercies, and the favorable interpositions of his Providence which we experienced in the course and conclusion of the late war—for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty, which we have since enjoyed—for the peaceable and rational manner, in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national One now lately instituted—for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed; and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and in general for all the great and various favors which he hath been pleased to confer on us.*



*And also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech him to pardon our national and other transgressions—to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually—to render our national government a blessing to all the people, by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed—to protect and guide all Sovereigns and Nations (especially such as have shown kindness unto us) and to bless them with good government, peace, and concord—to promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of science among them and us—and generally to grant unto all Mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as he alone knows to be best.*

*Given under my hand at the City of New York the third day of October in the year of our Lord 1789.*

Live according to what you have learned and accepted, what you have heard me say and seen me do. Then will the God of peace be with you.*
