WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

Don't be surprised if you get light-headed at church! As we get into April and May, it isn't unusual for people to get dizzy at Mass and even feel faint. I'm not certain why, but my theory is that the outside temperature can jump from chilly to warm pretty fast and the a/c in church can't keep up. This can happen to anyone – it has even happened to me. I ask that ushers be especially attentive, and altar servers, if you get woozy, just step away for a few minutes.

Thanking our altar servers and MC's. So many parishioners and visitors talk about the importance of Mass being reverent, and that they appreciate the reverence they experience at St. Remy. What you may not realize is how important our altar servers are in this. Even more hidden is the role of the masters of ceremony (MC's)— the older boys who guide the servers at the 9 a.m. Mass and on special occasions, such as during Holy Week.

These boys volunteered for this duty, and it is a big responsibility, on top of their school work, athletics, and other duties at home or at work. I don't mind saying that Holy Week is tiring and stressful for me as a priest, but the skill and dedication of our altar servers makes a huge difference, because I don't have to worry about them knowing what to do. The MC's take care of that! Several high school and junior high gentlemen volunteered to serve at all the 7:00 a.m. weekday Masses during Lent. Thanks for getting up early to serve the Lord, boys! Now that Lent is over, our retired gentlemen will be back in action as servers at the weekday Masses.

Thank you gentlemen. Jonathan Bell and Nick Caldwell are seniors and so can “retire” from their duties as MC's this spring. Waiting in the wings are Ben Bohman, Aiden Shappie, and Sam York, who will take the lead roles next year; they've actually been providing good leadership already.

Of course, it's not really true that anyone “has” to retire as an altar server; you are always welcome and appreciated!

Thanking our altar servers: Wednesday, April 28 after CCD. I will have a brief time of prayer in church and then some snacks afterward for all our altar servers of all ages. Mark your calendar!

Where are the stained-glass windows? I was asked this last week, and tempted to announce that I'd gotten a really good offer, and so sold them during the Right to Life Garage Sale – but Palm Sunday didn't seem the right day for cracking a joke like that. (You do realize I'm joking, right?) In fact, the windows are being restored; expect these windows to return in a few weeks and others to be taken away for similar work. Not all windows need restoration, because some were worked on some years back.

I will come to you. Another reminder that anyone who isn't able to make it to Mass is welcome to call the parish office about having Holy Communion brought to you. A volunteer goes every week; I visit on first Fridays. Likewise, I am very pleased to visit you at home for Confession and for the Anointing of the Sick.

First Holy Communion is April 18, and it will be CROWDED. As always, this will be the 11 a.m. Mass. I realize lots of people will want to be there for someone special to you, but it will be helpful for everyone if this Mass isn't too full.

Season Two of The Chosen

The critically acclaimed online series about the life of Christ, **The Chosen**, is returning for its second season. The first episode is scheduled to release for free viewing on The Chosen app this Easter Sunday, April 4. Director Dallas Jenkins notes that the second season will focus on "how the relationships between the disciples start to develop." One of the most widely hailed aspects of the series is the humanity that it brings to these biblical figures. The apostles were men of their time, complete with flaws and pride. Although there sometimes seems to be friction among the Apostles, they all work to achieve the same goal. The second season of *The Chosen* will continue in the first season's footsteps. Bringing every-day interactions between biblical figures to the forefront, the show illuminates the realities of life in the first century.

The Chosen is the largest crowdfunded media project ever produced. The first season raised nearly \$10 million through online donations, and the second season received nearly the same. This year, they are running a "Pay it Forward" system, where viewers are invited to watch for free and asked to donate for someone else to watch as well. All proceeds will go toward financing season three, which already has raised \$1 million.

After the first episode of the second season airs on Easter Sunday, the seven subsequent episodes will be released each week after Easter. There are eight episodes in total, so get ready for two solid months of high-quality Christian viewing!

Divine Mercy



What is meant by “Divine Mercy?”

St. Maria Faustina, a Polish nun who was canonized by Pope John Paul II on April 30, 2000, received many messages and visions from our Lord in the 1930's. In obedience to her spiritual director, she wrote these messages in a diary. *All italicized quotations on this page are the words of Jesus to St. Faustina from this diary.* God, in His divine providence, chose to use St. Maria Faustina to remind the world in an exceptional way about the merciful love He has for everyone.

What does the Church teach about Divine Mercy?

The Church, by canonizing the messenger (St. Maria Faustina), canonizes the message (the revelations of Jesus to St. Faustina). Jesus requested of St. Maria Faustina a feast day in the Church to celebrate His Divine Mercy. On the day of this saint's canonization, the Holy Father officially declared that the Sunday after Easter will now be celebrated as **Divine Mercy Sunday** (on April 11 this year).

What does God want us to know about His Divine Mercy?

The concept of divine mercy is quite simple: God loves us infinitely, no matter how great our sins. More than anything, He wants us to turn away from our sins, turn toward His infinite mercy with the utmost trust and confidence, receive His mercy, and allow it to flow through us to others. Through the Passion and Death of Jesus, an infinite ocean of mercy was made available for all of us. But God, who created us with free will, will not force anything on us, not even His mercy. He must wait for us to turn from our sinfulness and ask for His mercy. Our Lord said to St. Faustina: *“This Feast emerged from the very depths of My mercy...It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter...I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fountain of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the Divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened.”*

What did Jesus tell St. Maria Faustina regarding “trust?”

Jesus' words to her about trust were these: *“I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in my mercy. Let them approach this sea of mercy with great trust. Sinners will attain justification, and the just will be confirmed in good. Whoever places his trust in My mercy will be filled with My divine peace at the hour of death. The graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive. Souls that trust boundlessly are a great comfort to Me, because I pour all the treasures of My graces into them. I rejoice that they ask for much, because it is My desire to give much, very much. No soul that has called upon My mercy has been disappointed or brought to shame.”*

What did Jesus tell her regarding “mercy?”

About mercy, Jesus said: *“I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are able to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to excuse or absolve yourself from it. I am giving you three ways of exercising mercy toward your neighbor: the first—by deed, the second—by word, the third—by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy, and it is an unquestionable proof of love for Me. By this means a soul glorifies and pays reverence to My mercy. If a soul does not exercise mercy somehow or other, it will not obtain My mercy on the day of Judgment. Oh, if only souls knew how to gather eternal treasure for themselves, they would not be judged, for they would forestall My judgment with their mercy. I desire that this mercy flow out upon the whole world through your heart. Let no one who approaches you go away without that trust in My mercy, which I so ardently desire for souls.”*
