WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

No more mandates! Finally, Governor Mike DeWine has announced the lifting of all special health orders regarding Covid; we had been following these at the direction of Archbishop Schnurr. This all is in effect June 5, although it's no secret that in Russia, we haven't seen many masks at Mass for a while. So what changes? The signs asking for mask-wearing will come down, and the remaining ropes will go away. Holy Communion will be distributed from the front, and we won't use the little dishes of disinfectant (high-proof, food-grade alcohol). The stand that the priest used for the Missal will go away, and we'll go back to the altar servers holding the Missal (the book of Mass prayers) for the priest at the beginning and end of Mass. All this will happen by June 5.

Waiting on the Precious Blood. I'm going to hold off awhile before resuming the distribution of the Precious Blood at Mass. Why? I have a suspicion that we may have a significant number of the faithful not drinking from the chalice, which is their choice; but if this is where things end up, that calls into question the appropriateness of routinely distributing the Precious Blood (as opposed to doing it only on special occasions). There has always been some level of misunderstanding about the Precious Blood; I can't tell you the number of times I've heard people refer to the chalice as "the wine," as if they don't quite realize that it's truly the Blood of Jesus. Very rarely do Catholics refer to the Host as only "the bread." The bishops' decision, 50 or so years ago, to introduce the distribution of the Precious Blood, was intended to be something the vast majority of Catholics would want and embrace; it was not to be something only a small number would take advantage of because it gives a fuller experience of, and appreciation for, the reality of the Eucharist (which is both Body and Blood). So I would be against distributing the Precious Blood every week if a significant portion of those present weren't going to receive the Precious Blood, either for hygienic or other reasons. So, for these reasons, I'll hold off a bit on that. In the meantime, I will try to provide some teaching – both in the bulletin and at Mass – on the Eucharist.

The return of the Mass obligation. This needs some explanation, as well. Effective Sunday, June 6, the normal moral obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days resumes. This means it is a mortal sin to neglect attending Mass without – please pay attention now! – **without a good reason.**

There are lots of reasonable causes for someone to miss Mass: you don't have transportation; you're a kid, and no one brought you; you are sick; you are taking care of someone who is sick or just can't be left alone; you are called into work; you make an honest mistake about the Mass times; getting to the nearest Mass presents a genuine hardship; you are concerned about catching something, so you stay away; you aren't steady on your feet; you may need to make an urgent trip to the bathroom at any moment. These are examples; more could be supplied. In my experience, the people who actually need to take the Mass obligation seriously are those who never think about it at all. Meanwhile, there are folks who are way too hard on themselves, saying things like, "Well, I wasn't *that* sick!" Please use common sense and call me if you have a question.

What is scrupulosity? Why should you read any more about it? Some Catholics, as they strive to be better informed and more diligent in their faith, can go overboard. (This obviously isn't limited to Catholics, of course.) This going overboard can take several forms. Sometimes people have a reflexive, "more is better" mindset: if confession once a month is good, then once a week is better; if once a week is good, then more than once a week is better, and so it goes. Some good folks get focused on what they think they "owe" God and start with one Rosary a day; then it's two and three; oh, and I absolutely have to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet every day – and it has to be right at 3 p.m.! And so it goes. What should start out as a good way to pray and to calm oneself turns into a terrible chore, all bound up with fear (I didn't finish my Rosary, what will Mary say?!).

Scruples can also be connected to some emotional or psychological disturbances which deserve to be treated by competent professionals. I'm certainly not a psychologist or therapist, but my time as a priest has taught me to respect what they can do for people. Depression, obsessive-compulsive patterns of thought, and other difficulties are real things and must be given the right medical attention.

This can make confession torture. Where scrupulosity tends to take root most is in how people approach their sense of sin, and how they experience God's mercy – that is to say, some folks will become so extremely focused on sinfulness that they doubt they really are forgiven, or that they didn't stay in a state of grace very long. (FYI, there was a movement for some time called Jansenism, which I won't go into, except to say that it similarly went overboard in these matters. I bring it up because some websites or high-profile people can lapse into this kind of severity because they want to prove how orthodox they are, and some equate being orthodox to being severe.

Saint Thomas Aquinas said it best: *virtus stat in media*, or in English, "virtue stands in the middle." What we want is balance and common sense, not going to extremes. God does not need us to do anything extreme, and we can never pay Him what we owe Him. There is a good website called <https://scrupulouslyanonymous.org/> which I recommend.



It's Time to Pay for the Steubenville Youth Conference





Supreme Court to Decide on Mississippi's 15-week Abortion Ban: Could Modify *Roe v. Wade* Decision

The following information was found at LifesiteNews.com on May 17, 2021.



The U.S. Supreme Court has agreed to hear a challenge to a Mississippi law banning abortion at 15 weeks of pregnancy, which challenges the “viability” threshold of current legal precedent and therefore sets

the stage for a decision that will either uphold, overturn, or modify *Roe v. Wade*.

An order list released Monday by the Court reveals that it has agreed to take up *Dobbs v. Jackson Women’s Health Organization*, which concerns Mississippi’s HB 1510 law banning abortions from being committed past 15 weeks for any reason other than physical medical emergencies or severe fetal abnormalities. After its enactment in 2019, U.S. District Judge Carlton Reeves quickly issued a temporary restraining order against enforcing the law, then declared it unconstitutional in a ruling filled with pro-abortion talking points rather than legal arguments. Nevertheless, the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals sided with Reeves, prompting appeal to the nation’s highest court.

The Fifth Circuit claimed that an “unbroken line dating to *Roe v. Wade*” had firmly entrenched the “right” to pre-viability abortion but that “unbroken line” is precisely what Mississippi and other pro-life states intend to challenge. Attorneys with the Life Legal Defense Foundation have noted that the Court has also acknowledged a “compelling interest in protecting the unborn child” as pregnancy progresses, particularly on criteria like fetal pain, which can be felt before viability.

Please pray for our Supreme Court Justices regarding this decision and all decisions that they make. Pray for wisdom, courage, right judgement, and God’s grace for each Justice, empowering each one to make rulings that honor Almighty God.

Give them courage and strength to confront every obstacle that gets in the way of them doing Your holy will. Protect their minds, bodies, souls, and families from the evil one. Bless them with wisdom and right judgement as they go about their work. Help them to remember that they are Your servants, and that all power comes from You and is to be used for Your glory and for the good of Your people. Amen.
