# WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

**Corpus Christi Procession next week (June 6) after 11 a.m. Mass.** If you aren't able to join in by walking, maybe come and gather along the route and join in prayer. The procession will begin around noon.

**Men's Prayer Walk: Friday, June 18, 5 p.m.** We'll gather in the main parking lot as before, and ride hay wagons out to walk part of the parish boundary. All ages and conditions are welcome; if you can't walk, you can ride! We'll walk and pray, then eat and build friendships.

**How to choose Godparents.** A parishioner posed this question for me to answer here (with some details left out): "We are having difficulty choosing Godparents for our baby due \_\_\_\_\_. My siblings and in-laws are all practicing Catholics. My spouse has two siblings who bragged about how they only go to church on Christmas and Easter...we initially decided to choose Godparents from one side of the family, but we don't want to have hard feelings with the other side. Any advice?"

That's a tough situation, faced by a LOT of people. Start by being very clear in your own mind about what a Godparent is. It is not merely an honorary title, but an important spiritual role in the life of the newly baptized. One way to approach this might be to re-frame the question to the sibling who is an inactive Catholic: "Dearest sibling: I am praying about one of the most important decisions I'm going to make for my newborn child, and I want your advice..."

"Wait, you want *my* advice? I never go to church!"

"Sure, you're my sister/brother..."

"What's the question?"

"I want to make sure that my newborn child will have really good spiritual role models in her life, people who will be able to explain to them what we believe, show her prayers like the Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and be someone to talk to about faith questions. Who can you think of in our family who best fits that?"

My guess is that inactive Catholics will have enough self-awareness not to nominate themselves, even as they ask, "Oh, is that what you expect from a Godparent? Wow..." Then they may either suggest someone who IS a serious Catholic or admit they don't know who to suggest. And it may facilitate that sibling thinking about his or her own spiritual life a little more, and perhaps being ready to be a Godparent for baby number two. And when someone else asks, "Why did you choose who you chose," this is your answer. I'm not saying it will prevent bad feelings – that may be impossible – but it gives a truthful and reasonable answer. Can you reasonably ask someone to model what he or she doesn't believe?

This, by the way, is why a Godparent must be a Catholic, as opposed to belonging to another faith. And while the Church allows a non-Catholic Christian to be a "Christian witness," to be candid, this really is an honorary thing; the Christian witness is not the same thing as a Godparent.

**What about air conditioning in the confessional?** Good news: we've located a small-enough unit that can be mounted inside the confessional. This is less costly and will be more effective than trying to connect to the a/c that cools the rest of the church, given the cramped space available for the needed duct-work. The next step is running outside electrical service to that part of the building. In the meantime, the only thing to do is keep the confessional door open and run a fan, so it's cool before confessions start.

## THE MORNING OFFERING SANCTIFIES OUR DAY

As Catholics, we have a tradition of offering up our day to God each morning so that everything we do and experience will be for Him. Although it is now an old tradition, not all Catholics know about it. The origins of this prayer may go back to St. Paul, who wrote: "Whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God" (1 Cor 10:31). There are many versions of this prayer that you can use. [The following version is taught in our CCD program at St. Remy:]

*O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You all my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of this day, for all the intentions of Your Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all my relatives and friends, and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father. Amen.*

As I feel very called to pray for priests, I offer up every day for priests. I have also offered up my day for a friend or relative who is sick, and for people I was close to who had recently died. I also ask each day for God's help and an increase in virtues. The morning offering is not meant to be a substitute for time dedicated to prayer, but is a part of the Catholic tradition of transforming all our daily tasks into prayer.



## Day of Prayer and Reparation for the Murder and Abuse of Unborn Children

We cannot pretend to believe that a human force alone will cast out the darkness of abortion and its repulsive industry and sever the grip of the culture of death, which penetrates our world deeply and is in the minds and hearts of people. To defeat evil and counteract the culture of death, we need to bend our knees in prayer, do penance, and offer reparation.

After much prayer and reflection and desire to bring greater attention to the plight of the unborn, Human Life International (HLI) is inaugurating "A Day of Prayer and Reparation for the Murder and Abuse of Unborn Children." This event will be held annually on the Feast of the Visitation of Our Lady, May 31. [Please see the flyer enclosed in this bulletin, which includes a prayer for this intention.] I am asking all pro-lifers and people of good will, in every level of ecclesial and civil society, to join me and HLI's global family in offering this prayer and making this act of reparation.

We face a prevailing violence, a "conspiracy against human life" in our day. The culture of death "is actively fostered by powerful cultural, economic, and political currents which encourage an idea of society excessively concerned with efficiency." A preoccupation with the pleasures of earthly life has provoked a war of the powerful against the vulnerable. And once people identify the purpose of human existence as limited to this temporal world, anyone—the unborn child, elderly, sick, handicapped, and dying—who stands in their way is a threat and is to be eliminated.

This situation is enabled and emboldened by the progressive weakening in individual consciences and in society that has lost the sense of the incomparable worth of the human person. Consequently, many are unable to discern what is good, true, and beautiful from what is evil, false, and grotesque. The lines have become distorted. Many now declare what is good to be evil and what is evil to be good. Moreover, the moral weakening of our resistance to the culture of death has made most insensitive, blind to the crimes and violence of abortion, euthanasia, embryonic stem cell research, human trafficking, pornography, and the exploitation and commercialization of unborn children.

Because of the widespread moral uncertainty and the hostile environment elicited, a fundamental truth is ignored—the intrinsic dignity of the human person, beginning from conception and enduring through to natural death. Catholics believe, "being in the image of God, the human individual possesses the dignity of a person, who is not just seen as something, but someone...And he is called by grace to a covenant with his Creator, to offer him a response of faith and love that no other creature can give in his stead" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 357).

Human life must be valued infinitely and be treated with the respect due to a human person because of who he is, not because of what he can do. Therefore, every person is of incomparable worth, more important than things, and is valuable, laying claim to certain fundamental rights in virtue of what he or she is. Because human dignity is inherent, every human being of whatever age, size, degree of development, or physical or mental abilities has equal fundamental dignity. There is no moment or stage when a person's life may be worthy and at another point be unworthy. This understanding and belief must be the starting point of every decision and action; it should influence our behavior, how we live, and the choices we make; it should give shape to how we relate to other people, create laws, and build societies and nations.
