WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

Time for another pictorial directory. We are setting up times for photographs right now, so please sign up! We do this every five years, and let's be candid: it's a big operation, and it may seem tedious, but it's a very valuable resource. I assume lots of people use it the way I do. I look up someone whose face I recognize, but whose name I can't remember, or I use it to figure out the kids. Plus a lot of parishioners like having the information about the parish that always gets included. While I don't really care about having current photos of myself, I can see why many like this, as well.

One BIG benefit: this is a chance for the parish office to update your address and telephone. This is a CRITICAL need. Like it or not, crises happen for all of us, and I get calls or emails every week saying, "Did you know so and so is in the hospital?" I will immediately call, only to find out our contact information is NO GOOD. In recent years, a lot of folks have cancelled land lines and gone solely with cell service. As a result, I don't have any way to contact you when time is short. Please know that I do NOT give out any address/phone information to ANYONE. If you changed your telephone number any time in the past few years, and would like the parish to have it, please email Maria: stremy@roadrunner.com.

Also, if you live in the area and come regularly to St. Remy, you don't have to register here, but it might be helpful if you do. That way you'll be included on email updates. If you want to register, contact Maria at the same email listed above, or you can approach me after Mass and I'll give you a registration form.

I will be traveling...Monday, June 21 to Friday, July 2. I'm headed to a beach. The other priest with whom I'm traveling (we're hoping to snag a third, maybe a fourth) and I will be praying for you, offering Mass for you. This may surprise you, but it never really slowed down after Holy Week, so I am looking forward to some rest.

Combatting the porn plague. I've gotten the message indirectly that some parishioners don't like me talking about this; it's distasteful, I understand. I think some folks are in denial about how bad a problem this is. Many people remember a day when you had to go to certain stores to buy magazines and videos, and it wasn't something you wanted anyone you knew to see you doing. This is a very different world; stuff is instantly available, and it is filthy beyond your imagining. We are not talking about what used to be called "girlie" magazines.

Do you wonder why we don't have more priests? I am convinced that pornography is one hidden reason. Lots of good young men want to be holy, but because they struggle with this, they rule themselves out from the priesthood. Still, they figure they can get married. I suspect many young men (and young women, who are increasingly getting ensnared, too) figure marriage will "cure" the problem. (It won't.)

Keeping it secret makes it worse. Of course this is very difficult to talk about – who do you go to? But I will just tell you from my reading and experience, simply opening up to one trusted person can make a huge difference. This is true with lots of addictive and embarrassing problems. It's so much harder to fight all by yourself. Also, some problems are like mold—they fester in darkness, and light helps drive them away.

You can talk to me. I'm the only person who reads my email and listens to messages left in my voicemail. If you want to talk face-to-face, all you have to do is call or email and say, "Can we make an appointment to talk about an issue?" Our conversation will be confidential, and if you like, we can have it away from the parish office. Of all the people in a 100-mile radius, I am the least-shockable person around, believe me. And I am REALLY good at keeping my trap shut.

Holy Communion at the hospitals. It is very important, when you enter the hospital, to tell the staff you want to be on the list of Catholic patients. Why? Because that means you get Holy Communion on a regular basis! Although policies vary, in many cases hospitals will provide information to the local parish about Catholic patients, so that when the priest or a volunteer makes routine visits, they will call on all patients whose names are given them. At Upper Valley Medical Center, for example, it was routine before Covid for someone to bring the Eucharist 3 or 4 times a week! But the only way you get included on such a list is if you tell the hospital you want this.






Universal Intention: Let us pray for young people who are preparing for marriage with the support of a Christian community; may they grow in love, with generosity, faithfulness, and patience.

Lebanon Becomes Ohio's First "Sanctuary City" for the Unborn

The following information was taken from an article written by Michael Gryboski, who writes for Christian Post Reporter.

Lebanon has become the first city in the state of Ohio to pass an ordinance that bans abortions in its jurisdiction after its leadership unanimously voted to approve the measure. The Lebanon City Council, whose city has a population of about 20,000, voted Tuesday evening to pass the ordinance.

The meeting had a packed crowd, with several locals speaking for and against the ordinance before Councilman Doug Shope, who sponsored the proposal, spoke about the measure. "We had been talking about some of the ridiculous sanctuary city things that have been done in other parts of the country," said Shope. "Wouldn't it be great if we had a sanctuary for the unborn?"

One councilwoman who opposed the ordinance resigned from the city council in advance of the vote, denouncing the political climate of the local government, saying, "It is not fair to the citizens and is not the role of a city council member to be a moral compass."

Created Equal, a pro-life group that helped Shope get in touch with the group Sanctuary City for the Unborn to craft the ordinance, celebrated the result of the city council vote. "Ohio is once again taking the lead to protect children, and more cities are joining this movement every week," stated Created Equal president Mark Harrington.


