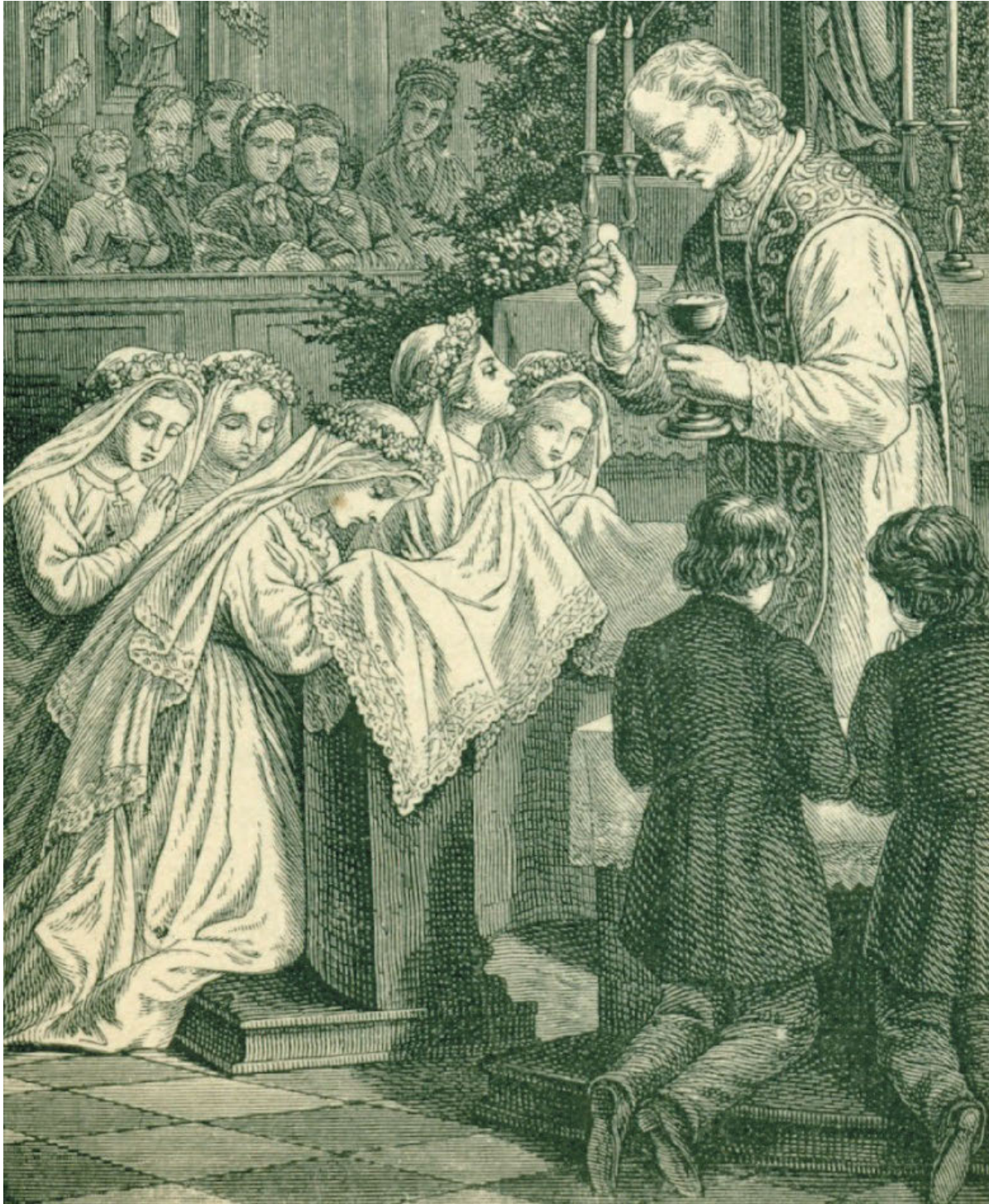

WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

Thank you to our servers! This Wednesday, after religion classes, all our altar servers (of all ages) are invited to a thank you party. We'll meet in church for a brief time of prayer, then I'll have pizza and ice cream afterward. We will finish by 9 p.m.

All year, our altar servers are very diligent and give a powerful example of reverence and prayer. During Holy Week, our senior servers provide excellent leadership in particular. A lot of folks comment every year on how well things work out for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Saturday Easter Vigil. What they may not know is how much of that depends on the servers who are "masters of ceremonies" (MC's) at these liturgies. They eagerly step forward each year to provide leadership, recruiting other servers, organizing rehearsals, and then keeping things going. The truth is, I was not a very good altar server in my time, and as a seminarian, I would assist the Archbishop as his MC – and I wasn't so good at that, either.

Want to be an altar server? Mark Tuesday, May 17 and Wednesday May 18 from 3:15-4:45 p.m. on your calendar. Tell mom and dad! Watch for information to be distributed in CCD classes. Contact the parish office! Watch the Facebook Page! Don't let this opportunity pass you by! All boys and girls completing 5th grade and older are welcome.

What about distributing the Precious Blood at Mass? A few weeks ago, the Archbishop sent out a note saying that effective April 24, parishes can start offering the Precious Blood at Masses. As you know, this has been suspended for about two years due to Covid. So now what? I think several steps are necessary before we restart this. My main concern is that we may have a significant number of folks who still are leery of drinking from a common chalice in the wake of Covid. The teaching of the Church (in *Redemptionis Sacramentum*) is that the Precious Blood shouldn't be distributed at Mass when a "notable" portion of those present do not receive. Why is that? Because it isn't a good thing to create a situation in which a significant number of people avoid, or feel repugnance toward, the Holy Eucharist!

My view is that we should take some time for some explanation and teaching on the subject. Since I am preparing to move on, this is also something I intend to coordinate with Father Ned Brown, your pastor effective July 1.

Reaching me: cell vs. landline. My cell phone number isn't exactly a secret, but I don't advertise it. Why not? Because, for various reasons, I prefer to keep my cell phone for emergencies only. I have a voice mailbox at the church's land line (937-526-3437) that works perfectly well, so I ask people to call that number in all cases, *especially in an emergency*. That's because if you call the land line first, and hit #1, the emergency line, that will trigger an emergency alert on my cell phone. Then one of two things will happen. If I'm in bed, I'll pick up the phone immediately. Or, if not, then the office phone system will send repeated messages to my cell phone, over and over, until I call back. That works pretty well.

Why does the priest give me the penance he does? Do you wonder where a priest comes up with a penance of "three Our Fathers?" I do it this way because I know folks are often distracted and don't need anything complicated to remember. Maybe they can't hear me very well, or they are in a hurry. I give a penance that can be performed right away. It is nice if I can make some connection between what the person confessed and the penance, but that isn't easy to do, and again, I don't want to make things complicated.

Remember, penance isn't like paying a fine; it's not a penalty! Rather, our penance is an offering we make to God as a kind of reparation. It's obviously not enough—it never could be enough. But it is fitting to offer something. Also, realize that your absolution is not conditional on doing the penance! When the priest absolves you, you are – in that moment – forgiven.

Sometimes Father gives advice, other times not. Why is that? One reason I might not offer any advice is because I can't think of anything pertinent. Also, there may be a long line, and I'm trying to take care of as many people as I can. What's more, sometimes priests and penitents can treat confession as a kind of counseling session, but that's not what it is, and the two things shouldn't be mixed up. Actual counseling usually takes far more time; it goes way beyond one's sins. Someone might need guidance on an important decision, or on solving a problem. If someone wants counseling, I'm going to ask a LOT of questions to get at the problem. But in confession, I will try to avoid asking questions; unexpected questions are very intimidating.

So, if you have a problem, I'll be happy to talk about it – but let's do it outside of confession. My telephone number and email address are listed below. No one but me reads my emails, and when you get my voicemail, I'm the only one who will listen to your message.

As we pray the Chaplet, begging for God’s mercy, we will hopefully be inspired to be merciful to others. Let’s consider several concrete ways to do this:

Go to Confession. In a profound sense, going to Confession is an acknowledgement of the holiness of God, and it honors Him when we humble ourselves. Learning humility helps us to be merciful to all God’s people.

Feed the hungry. Donate to a food drive, volunteer at a soup kitchen, or make a meal for a family in need.

Visit the sick. Reach out to a family member or neighbor who is sick, elderly, or homebound. Your thoughtfulness will be deeply appreciated.

make a positive difference in someone’s life without ever leaving home!
