DOES FATHER FOX

Here are the results of the local participation in the upcoming synod. Last week I received a copy of the report—which is also available online at https://catholicaoc.org/synod—summarizing what was discussed and shared at a series of meetings held in January and February of this year. This is all part of a worldwide preparation for an upcoming "Synod on Synodality" to be culminated in a meeting of bishops from around the world in October, 2023.

Of course, a "synod on synodality" is confusing, but the point is that Pope Francis is trying to encourage more "listening" and "accompanying" by church leaders.

Here are some things that stood out to me in the report.

Approximately 1,700 people attended the various meetings in every part of the diocese.

Less than 1% were under 19; about 13% were under 24. Almost 2/3rds were over 50.

Clergy and members of religious orders were hugely over-represented, at about 9% of all participants. FYI, I did not attend. I wasn't able to, and in any case, I thought the meeting was meant for laity, not clergy.

Several times the following terminology was used: "What steps is the Holy Spirit inviting us to take?" That strikes me as rather arrogant; how can I (or anyone) claim to speak for the Holy Spirit? If I tell you the Holy Spirit says thus-and-so, doesn't that make it awkward for you to disagree?

There were several observations about better efforts for those with disabilities. For example, if you are deaf and only use sign language, there aren't many priests who understand sign language; if you are blind, what about materials in Braille? Let me pause to explain that such a language barrier does not prevent me from receiving your confession and giving you absolution. In the case of a deaf person, I'd write out things like, "Your penance is such-and-such" and "Say an act of contrition" and "I will now give you absolution." But that said, it is much nicer to know the priest understands you.

One concept that I heartily endorse: "Training in friendship/neighborhood evangelization to teach people how to invite and welcome others."

I found it notable that several people suggested things that have already been done. For example, one suggestion was to do surveys about why people leave the Catholic Faith. In fact, quite a lot of such surveys have been

conducted over the years.

One of the comments was that more efforts have to be made for "discussions" and "listening" and "feedback." I don't disagree, but I will observe that in my 19 years as a priest, I've seen quite a lot of such opportunities offered in various ways, and the number who took part was usually disappointing. The same thing happens with faith formation activities, which was another thing this report mentioned.

Another idea put forward was doing more surveys of parishioners' views. On this subject, I learned the hard way how this can be turned from a positive to a negative. In a prior assignment, I frequently surveyed parishioners. But where I dropped the ball (I apologize!) was in not making certain to communicate both the results of those surveys, and what, if any, impact those surveys had. I can attest that every time I did a survey, I carefully reviewed the results, and there's no doubt in my mind they influenced my course of action.

However, it was only some time later I realized that, unless I told everyone that, from the perspective of most parishioners, no one had paid any attention. But here's the more important takeaway: if you don't have a good plan for what you do with the survey results, and how you will communicate your actions, don't do the survey; you'll irritate people.

Tife Information For Everyone

Transgenderism, Truth, & Human Dignity

The following article was taken from the Spring 2022 newsletter of Teachers Saving Children, Inc.: Pro-Life Voices in Education. For more information, visit info@teacherssavingchildren.org.



Pro-life Americans understand the value inherent in every human being. When abortion was legalized in the U.S. in 1973, the family was immediately in danger of being attacked. The promotion for transgenderism as normal and its acceptance is yet another attack on objective truth and the family. Gender dysphoria, historically, has been a reality for a very small percentage (0.002-0.003 %) of biological females. In recent years, however, the percentage has increased 1,000% in the U.S. and 4.000% in Britain.

Mark Gavit, a 5th grade teacher in California, recently wrote about the challenges he faces with students who want to know the truth. What follows are some excerpts from his article:

There is an identity crisis in our world today. Youth are curious, and they long to know the truth. But the truth is often not what the world proclaims. They long to know the truth of who they are, the truth of their bodies, the truth of what it means to be human. In the basic, most simple explanation, to be human means that (1) we are created male and female and (2) we were made in the image of God. What does it really mean to be made in the image of God? It means that we each reveal an aspect of God that no one else can. This is what sets us apart from animals. Human beings are made male and female in the image of God. This is our first and foremost identity. It pains a worldly, godless society to learn that we don't get to make up who we are or what it means to be human. We don't get to make up our own truth of what our bodies are for and what they reveal about our innermost being.

As humans, we have a biological sex and a gender identity. What happens of our gender identity doesn't align with our biological sex? This is called gender identity disorder. We are all wounded in one way or another. Individuals who feel they are trapped in the wrong body have wounds that need healing. It might be the woman who was abused as a young girl, began to hate herself and her body, and so identified with the masculine as a way of protecting herself from the pain. It might be the creative boy who was cruelly bullied and found no pathway into masculine identification and became intrigued with the dazzling icons of empowered women celebrities. Here is the key point: embracing a transgender identity does not heal the pain, it only masks the pain.

The TRUTH of our identity is revealed through our bodies, not our feelings. We must realize that there is objective truth that exists outside of ourselves. And that objective truth is that we were created male or female at the moment of conception. Gender reassignment surgery destroys the body. When we believe we have dominion over our bodies, we become our own god.

When people hear the truth spoken with love and charity, their hearts can be opened and powerful healing can take place. We are all wounded in one way or another, and we are all in need of healing. To begin to heal, we must take an honest look at our innermost self, our past experiences, and our deepest longings. We must open up our brokenness and reveal it all to Christ. He is the Divine Physician who is ready to heal.

You are an unrepeatable creation, a gift of life and love.

Continuing to Trust in God's Mercy



The following excerpt was taken from the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska - Divine Mercy in My Soul. The type in bold face represents the words of God.

"When I entered my solitude, I heard these words:

'At the hour of their death, I defend as My own glory every soul that will say this chaplet; or when others say it for a dying person, the pardon is the same. When this chaplet is said by the bedside of a dying person, God's anger is placated, unfathomable mercy envelops the soul, and the very depths of My tender mercy are moved for the sake of the sorrowful Passion on My Son'" (Diary of St. Faustina, 811).
