WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

Winding down. People have been asking about the upcoming transition, so let me give some details. I expect to move almost all my stuff to the south side of Dayton by June 10 and will be basically living out of a suitcase after that. I will be traveling Sunday, June 12 to Friday, June 24 and my last Sunday here will be June 26.

Many people want to know where I will be living. The rectory for Father David Howard and me will be at 6340 Blossom Park Drive, near St. Henry Church. Two other priests, Father James Manning and Father Jerome Bishop, are also part of this new family, but they have other housing arrangements. My mailing address will be St. Henry Church, 6696 N. Springboro Pike, Dayton, OH 45449; the telephone number there is (937) 434-9231. In the near term, my office will be at St. Henry, and I'll be doing my best to be present at the other two campuses: Our Lady of Good Hope in Miamisburg and St. Mary of the Assumption in Springboro.

As you might expect, I am already thinning out my stuff and expect to do more of that, and I am beginning to organize and pack things. Also, I am attempting to tie up every loose end I can regarding parish matters, to make for as orderly a hand-off to Father Ned Brown, our new pastor, as possible. Meanwhile, I have all the usual change-of-address matters and changing-email issues to deal with. I apologize for being increasingly distracted.

This is as good a place to remind everyone that Father Ned Brown becomes pastor July 1, so any and ALL decisions about parish matters as of July 1 should be referred to him. I know he is making every effort to make as smooth a transition as possible, as am I, but it's all a little hectic for everyone involved, so please be patient. Related to that: Father James Reutter, who will be moving in sometime before July 1, will be around, but he won't be the pastor. Don't be surprised if, in answer to a question, he says, "That is something Father Brown will have to decide."

What about the Precious Blood at Mass? Last month, the Archbishop advised pastors they could begin distributing the Precious Blood at Mass, effective April 24. At that time, I reached out to Father Brown to discuss how to approach it. We agreed that some preparation would be advisable, and given the transitions underway, it seemed a good idea to let this be something Father Brown will spearhead instead of me.

Even so, this is a good opportunity to address some issues. One is that even before Covid, many at Mass were reluctant to drink from a shared chalice. While I have not felt that hesitation myself, I do not criticize anyone who takes a different approach. Let me take this moment to correct a misunderstanding. Many people said during Covid, "Oh, you can't get germs when you receive Holy Communion." Who says so?

Remember, in the consecration, the bread and wine become, in substance, the true Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. However, they retain their outward, physical properties. That means, for example, if I were to consume several chalices of the Precious Blood, I would feel tipsy. And if the Sacred Hosts were exposed to moisture, they could develop mold. So, if ordinary bread and wine can carry a germ, so can the Sacred Host and Precious Blood. It's not a matter of "having enough faith." All the good people who died last year, or lost their jobs, or had some other bad things happen—was that because they didn't have enough faith?

The Body = the Blood = ALL OF JESUS. Also remember that whether someone receives the Sacred Host, or drinks the Precious Blood, s/he receives ALL of Jesus. It's certainly meaningful to experience the Holy Eucharist under both forms, which is why the bishops decided in the 1960's to allow for more frequent distribution of the Precious Blood. However, there are practical issues involved, which is why the practice of distributing the Precious Blood became so infrequent for a long time.

There are also theological issues. Back at the time of the Protestant Reformation, many claimed – falsely – that you didn't really receive the Eucharist unless you received both forms. Or some claimed that you received "less" in some way. To this day, some well-intentioned Catholics make similar statements, that their reception of the Eucharist is somehow "less" if they can't drink from the chalice. But this can be seen to be obviously wrong when we recall that the Eucharist simply IS Jesus, and therefore, the tiniest particle of a Host, or the smallest drop of the Precious Blood, is a true communion with the Son of God and thereby, the Blessed Trinity.

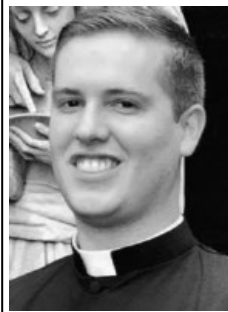

Message from Deacon Ethan Hoying

I will be ordained to the priesthood on May 21 (see invitation on page 4). I will offer my First Mass of Thanksgiving here at St. Remy on Sunday, May 22 at 1:30 p.m. An open house reception will follow from 2:30-5:30 at St. Remy Hall. All are welcome to attend the ordination, First Mass of Thanksgiving, and open house. I will offer a blessing to individuals at the hall; if you attend the Mass but are not able to make it to the hall, please see me right after Mass to request a blessing. Blessings will also be offered at the cathedral after the ordination Mass.

You may ask, "What's so special about attending a newly ordained priest's First Mass?" When a priest celebrates his First Mass after ordination, the faithful in attendance may gain a plenary indulgence if all the usual conditions are met. The usual conditions to acquire a plenary indulgence are: detachment from all sin, reception of Holy Communion on the day the indulgence is sought, prayer for the intention of the Holy Father on the day the indulgence is sought (one Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice), and sacramental confession (usually within 8 days). If one of these conditions is not met, the indulgence is partial.

You may also wonder, "What's so special about receiving a newly ordained priest's First Blessing?" A special grace may be gained from receiving a "first blessing" of a newly ordained priest. First blessings are powerful blessings which are customarily given when first Masses are celebrated, but they may be given up to a full year after ordination. After receiving the blessing, the faithful, in a long-standing tradition of the Church, kiss the palms of the newly ordained priest in recognition of the sacred character of his priesthood, the hands that now hold the Most Holy Eucharist and confer the sacraments. The priest's palms were anointed with sacred chrism during the rite of priestly ordination.

Deacon Hoying, a son of the parish, has prepared for his ordination for many years. Let us make a firm commitment to pray for him as he prepares to dedicate his life to Christ and His Holy Church.

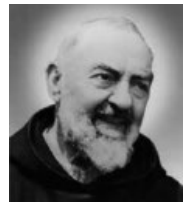
