



# WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

**Thank you to Mark Travis and Karen Rosenbeck.** On Friday, May 13, our youth director Mark Travis announced on our parish Facebook page that he has accepted a position as executive director of the Relic Shrine in Maria Stein. On Tuesday, Karen Rosenbeck announced her retirement after 20 years of dedicated service. Both Mark and Karen are planning to be available and involved over the summer to assist Father Ned Brown, our new pastor, in the transition.

Although changes like these can be unsettling, they are part of the life of a parish. Karen and her husband Vern, who recently retired as principal at St. Mary School in Greenville, certainly deserve the adventure of retirement together. And Mark is very gifted, so it was inevitable that an opportunity like this would find him. We were very blessed to have his dedicated leadership for eight years.

Moreover, as important as it is to have strong leadership, the deep reservoirs of faith and family life in this parish are what make this parish healthy. The bedrock beneath that, in turn, is the Rock of Jesus Christ Himself. Don't let this season of change disturb you.

**Father Brown is already working on this.** As I became aware of these things, I have kept our incoming pastor, Father Ned Brown, informed. He understands the importance of our youth and religious education programs. Father Brown told me he intends to move quickly to determine what is needed and to find the right people for the tasks. There may be a few bumps in the near term, but what's important is to plan and choose carefully for the long-term. I also explained to Father Brown that there are great volunteers involved in these programs who will also be able to help fill in the gaps during a period of transition.

**Traveling in June.** I will be away from the parish from Saturday evening, June 11 – after the wedding – until I return sometime on Friday, June 24, for a wedding rehearsal that evening. I will be attending an ordination for a friend in Baltimore, as well as his first Mass, and also visiting some family and friends and spending a few days at the beach.

**Fathers Hoying and Jones will be here while I'm away.** Father Stephen "Party" Jones will be here the first week I'm gone, and then Father Ethan Hoying will cover confessions and Mass during the next week. They will also be available for any other sacramental emergency.

**Race-consciousness** is racism. Last weekend, there was a horrendous crime in Buffalo in which many people were murdered in a grocery store. The apparent perpetrator (I won't say his name, let us deny him the notoriety he craves) wrote a manifesto that seems to be a semi-coherent hodgepodge of views. In any case, the victims were all black and he seems to be white. It appears at least some of his ideas were about white nationalism or white-identity consciousness.

While I certainly don't believe such ideas have many adherents, I am not naïve. Sometimes people get drawn gradually into believing some strange notions. They read or hear a slick presentation that seems to give the "real story" behind some big problem. Many times, I've been shocked to find a friend or relative buying into a crackpot theory.

So now you can hear it from me: any theory or idea of "race nationalism" or "white identity" is just plain old racism, gussied up in new clothing. This is, I suspect, something of a reaction to those promoting so-called "critical race theory," which asserts that racism and race-consciousness are baked into all of us and that we will never overcome it.

The Christian answer is a loud and long "NO!" God created a fascinating variety of human beings, of all shapes and hues, with lots of curious languages and cultures and customs, and every human being has the exact same dignity and worth, period. And that worth is infinite. St. Paul said that in Christ, we are no longer male or female, Jew or Greek, slave or free. And in any case, any notion of "race purity" is utter nonsense. Most likely, we are all "mutts," and who cares? The only purity that matters to God is moral and spiritual.

**Things I didn't get done.** When I first announced my reassignment, I cautioned that the complications of this transition would probably mean some things getting neglected. So, for example, I was unable to organize a women's event in March as I'd done in prior years, and I see no way to organize our annual men's prayer walk, usually in June. I regret this and hope you will forgive me. I encourage you to bring these matters to Father Brown's attention at some point. I am confident he will be glad to promote any number of traditions, but he may not know about them.


