WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

Changes in Mass schedule. Included in this bulletin is information regarding changes in the weekday and Sunday Mass schedules, which take effect July 1. Our incoming pastor, Father Ned Brown, has had to work very hard to pull this together, and I urge you to be understanding of the difficulty he's facing. Before this rearrangement, Father Jim Duell provided some Mass help in Versailles, Frenchtown, and Bradford, but he has been shifted to another cluster.

Another reason for these Mass changes is that Archbishop Schnurr, in consultation with the priests of the archdiocese, decided this is the time to correct a very longstanding challenge for the priests: that they have been expected to offer far more Masses than Church law envisions. Canon Law calls for priests to offer one Mass daily, two by exception—and two on Sunday, three by exception. For various reasons, what Church law meant to be exceptional became constant.

I realize many people cannot see any issue with a priest offering Mass three or even more times a day. I've tried to explain previously in this space why this is spiritually taxing to priests. The change needed to happen at some point—there is no particularly good time to do it, so this is when the issue is being dealt with.

As you might imagine, changing Mass schedules requires other things to be rearranged, and because Father Brown has a lot on his plate, that work falls on the desks of several of our staff who are helping to sort out all the details. This includes the Mass intentions people have requested, the scheduling of volunteers, and other events planned around weekday Masses. This also means that we may not think of everything, and if something is overlooked, I know Father Brown and our staff will be very sorry for any problems.

End (temporary, we hope) of the Traditional Latin Mass. It is with tremendous sorrow that I share this: the last time I will offer the older form of the Mass in Russia will be Wednesday, June 8 at 5:45 a.m. As I mentioned previously, I am traveling for two weeks in June, then I am heading to my new assignment.

Unfortunately, none of the four priests who are coming here are authorized to offer the older Mass, even privately. You see, when Pope Francis issued his *motu proprio* greatly restricting the Traditional Latin Mass, he only allowed those who were already doing so to offer it “privately,” and that is what permits me to offer the older Mass as I've done. Any priests who want to offer the older Mass after the issuance of that decree must have the permission of the Holy See.

Pope Francis said he was doing this because of bad behavior of some who were attached to the older form of the Mass. All I can say is that the people who have frequented the TLM in my experience were not the sort of people who deserved this punishment, and I believe it is unfair to punish everyone for the wrongs of a few.

I waited until now to make this announcement because I held out a slim hope that the priest most recently named to our family of parishes might be permitted to offer the older form of the Mass. Father Ned Brown wishes it were otherwise, and anyone who knows of a priest who has permission to offer the Traditional Latin Mass is welcome to contact him.

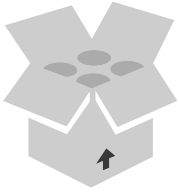
