WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

What about the altar rail idea? Last month, Laura Counts, a member of the Pastoral Advisory Council, and I met with an architect who came up with several ideas. Laura and I eliminated two of those ideas, and then the final suggestion came back to the Pastoral Council for discussion at the May meeting. The decision was to hold off for now. Here's why.

In order to install any kind of altar rail, it is necessary to build out into the nave, that is, where the pews are. What many don't realize is that not only must there be room for the rail itself, and the place for people to kneel, there also must be enough room for the priest and server to maneuver behind it without tripping. Also, there needs to be enough room for those coming to Communion to move around, including those in wheelchairs or using walkers. Once all this is accounted for, it would become necessary either to remove a row of pews, or else to respace the pews to be an inch closer to each other. The only alternative to building out would be to reconstruct the sanctuary.

The Pastoral Council suggested we come back to this idea down the road, after we see how Mass attendance may change after we are part of the "family" of neighboring parishes, with a new Mass schedule.

Meanwhile, it occurred to Laura, the architect, and me that the two kneelers we now use at the base of the sanctuary steps could be replaced with a single, two-person kneeler which would still be moveable, but could be built in such a way as to be very stable and unlikely to be kicked askew accidentally. I will suggest this to Father Brown, our incoming pastor. He was very interested in the feasibility of an altar rail, and he may want to return to the idea down the road, but that will be his decision.

This is a good time to explain that if an altar rail were restored, that doesn't mean how Holy Communion is distributed at regular Masses would change, reverting back to the old-fashioned manner. For those too young to remember, before 1970, people would kneel (or stand if they couldn't kneel) along the rail, and the priest and server would move back and forth. While I think this way of distributing the Eucharist works well, the bishops decided to nix this for the new Mass; it remains the method used in the older form of the Mass.

With Bishop Fernandes in Columbus. On Tuesday, May 31, I was privileged to concelebrate the Mass at which my friend, Father Earl Fernandes, was ordained a bishop and was then immediately installed as Bishop of Columbus. Bishop Fernandes' years at Mount Saint Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati overlapped with mine; he was ordained a priest a year before me. I am not surprised he was chosen to be a bishop; it was something we all joked about back then.

The ordination took place not at St. Joseph Cathedral in downtown Columbus, but at St. Paul the Apostle Church in Westerville, north of Columbus. St. Paul is a substantially larger church than the cathedral in Columbus, and it was filled. Many priests from our archdiocese came, in addition to Columbus's priests and others as well. About 30 or so bishops came from around the country. Archbishop Dennis Schnurr was present and was one of three bishops who consecrated Bishop Fernandes. By ancient custom, it is always three, so as to give even greater assurance of the bishop being validly ordained. You may not realize, however, why Archbishop Schnurr was there. He is the "Metropolitan" of the province of Ohio, meaning he has precedence over the other bishops in the state – that's why he is an arch-bishop, heading an archdiocese. In olden times, a metropolitan had more powers over his region, but in latter days, it's more a "first among equals" thing. This event illustrates one role of a metropolitan – to oversee the ordination of a bishop in his province.

Bishop Fernandes grew up in Toledo, one of several boys, raised by immigrants from India. His father died a few years ago, and his mother is very frail and was only able to participate in the ordination Mass via the Internet. Bishop Fernandes always speaks movingly of his parents; he stated at a news conference recently that without them, "I would be absolutely nothing," which is literally true.

People wonder what sort of bishop he will be. I have no crystal ball; however, I can share the following. First, anyone who sees him for 30 seconds will notice he smiles. He is always warm and friendly. Second, he is whip smart. Third, he is an excellent public speaker, and he is often very funny. Fourth, he loves and values the Church's tradition. He taught me to offer the Traditional Latin Mass, and as far as I know, he still celebrates it. Finally, I've always known him to be hard-working and dedicated. I am confident he will work hard for the people of Columbus.

Traveling at the moment. I wrote this before I headed out of town on June 11. I'll see you again on Saturday, June 25.

From the Deacon's Desk

The following article was written by Deacon Mike Meyer.



There is a very old and much-repeated story about St. Augustine, one of the intellectual giants of the Church. He was walking by the seashore one day, attempting to conceive of an intelligible explanation for the mystery of the Trinity. As he walked along, he saw a small boy on the beach pouring seawater from a shell into a small hole in the sand. "What are you doing, my child?" asked Augustine. "I am trying to empty the sea into this hole," the boy answered with an innocent smile. "But that is impossible, my dear child," said Augustine. The boy stood up, looked straight into the eyes of Augustine, and replied, "What you are trying to do—comprehend the immensity of God with your small head—is even more impossible." Then he vanished.

The child was an angel sent by God to teach Augustine a lesson. Later, Augustine wrote: "You see the Trinity if you see love." According to him, the Father is the lover, the Son is the loved one, and the Holy Spirit is the personification of the very act of loving. This means that we can understand something of the Mystery of the Holy Trinity more readily with the heart than with our feeble minds.

Evagrius of Pontus, a Greek monk of the 4th century who came from modern day Turkey and lived out his vocation in Egypt, said: "God cannot be grasped by the mind. If God could be grasped, God would not be God."

It is interesting to note four facts about the Trinity in the Christian life:

~All prayers in the Church begin in the Name of the Holy Trinity and end glorifying the Trinity.

~All sacraments are administered in the Name of the Holy Trinity. We are baptized, confirmed, anointed, forgiven, and blessed as we are married, and bishops, priests, and deacons are ordained, in the Name of the Trinity.

~Church bells ring three times daily—6 a.m., noon, and 6 p.m.—to remind us to pray to the Holy Trinity.

~We bless ourselves, and the priest blesses us, in the Name of the Holy Trinity.

“Bleacher Brothers” Tour Major League Ballparks to Evangelize

What began as a dream in 2013 for two friars who connected over their love of baseball has become an 11-week, 30-city, 17,000-mile tour to all the Major League ballparks in the U.S. Father Casey Cole and Father Roberto “Tito” Serrano—also known as the “Bleacher Brothers”—are Franciscan Friars who were inspired by their order’s founder, St. Francis, to “preach the Gospel wherever people have gathered—ordinary places, not just within the walls of a church,” as explained on their website.

“We want to make ourselves available,” Father Serrano explained. “We want people to come up to us and be curious because we are curiously

dressed...and that gives us an opening to share our life, to share our fraternity, and to share the gospel message in a different way.”

Driving across the country in a rented van, the Bleacher Brothers won’t only be hitting ballparks to watch the games and throw opening pitches, as Father Serrano did for the Miami Marlins on May 20. They will also be speaking at parishes, schools, and diocesan offices. Their message, according to Father Cole, is one of “promoting vocations and inspiring people to be faithful citizens and to be engaged in the world.” Father Serrano further explained their mission as one of bridging the secular and the sacred: “I think that this allows us to...find places where a large number of people are gathered, but also at the same time broach the subject of why we are creating this sort of false distance between what is considered secular and sacred,” he said. “Really, God is in all.”
