WHAT DOES FATHER FOX SAY?

This is my last column. I will share some personal thoughts here, and I hope even those who don't much read the bulletin will see this.

Some words for our children and young people. If you didn't know, I tried to give you special attention. My pastor, as a boy, seemed awfully intimidating; I never wanted you to see me that way. As a teenager, I never thought about seeking out the priest for any advice; as your priest, I always wanted you to feel safe in approaching me. It can be difficult to see the priest, who became familiar to you, move on. I just want you to know that wherever life takes either of us, I'll always be happy to see you. If you find your way down to Dayton and say hello, that will be a treat for me. And if the opportunity arises in years to come for me to help you, that will be my greatest joy.

Believe me, Russia is special. I remember heading off to college, thinking I was way smarter than I was, and not appreciating what I had. That happens to all of us. Graduates, the wider world has a lot to offer and a lot of attractions, and it can be easy to feel our little village isn't much in comparison. But I can hardly imagine a better place to raise a family than this community.

Any regrets? I regret every time I was impatient or sarcastic in any response, and like any of us, I think of missed opportunities. If there is anyone to whom I owe an apology, I am sorry for not realizing it and not offering that apology. This isn't really the best way, but I ask your forgiveness.

Unfinished business. There were some things I had hoped to pursue, which must now be turned over to others. Before Covid, I was trying to stir us all up to be bolder in sharing our faith. Always remember that sharing our faith isn't a matter of being a theologian or in winning arguments, but in living our faith fully and letting that show. Always ask the Holy Spirit for boldness to speak gracefully when the opportunity arises. Also, I had hoped to launch a schola choir, which would focus on a cappella chant. There was definitely interest, but it wasn't easy to find someone who could lead it, and Covid, again, derailed the effort.

A future altar rail? I advised Father Brown of the work done in the past few months on a possible altar rail; a file folder waits for him with all my notes.

New educational facilities? Father Brown is also very aware of the interest in replacing the Parish Center with much improved facilities for religious education, youth programs, and other activities. I did some quiet work on this the past month or so—quiet because we want to let our Russia School pursue it's plans with no confusion caused by a parish project.

Ongoing projects: Parishioners should expect to hear about work on the parking lots. There are some spots needing major attention, and unfortunately, that will cost real money, especially with oil prices soaring. One of the things I'm proud of is trying to keep our facilities in good shape, but that credit goes overwhelmingly to our Pastoral Council, staff members, and volunteers who all do their part.

Finances are excellent. Thanks to your continued generosity, our parish looks to finish the year – ending June 30 – in the black. We were in good shape when I came in 2014, and our balance sheet has improved. The only concern I have is that we do need to see our cemetery fund grow over the next few decades.

Your faith is the bedrock of our parish. It has always been a source of tremendous joy and satisfaction as a priest to be in a community where the faith comes first. You fill our pews and keep me busy in the confessional. You have been such an encouragement to me, all the time. Priests get discouraged and are tempted to cynicism; witnessing your faith and receiving your support and kindness week by week is the best of all medicine. Thank you!

Jesus said: Be not afraid! This time of change tempts us to worry because we don't know what the future holds. But the truth is, we never know the future! In that sense, Beacons of Light changes nothing! Realize that faith in Christ makes us strong and able to withstand anything.

There's not much more for me to say, other than I love you and I thank you. Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever.

Message from our New Pastor, Father Ned Brown, Concerning Beacons of Light



This new assignment of the North West Region 5 Family of Parishes promises to be my most challenging assignment to date. It will expose and exasperate my own human weaknesses and shortcomings, which I ask you to handle with patience. I already anticipate many of the decisions that need to be made might affect negatively upon one parish over another, as I may be asking of them a sacrifice they do not want to accept or offer, while seemingly favoring the other. I am well aware, and hopefully you are too, that the future is full of many uncertainties, contradictions, and difficult, heart-wrenching decisions concerning our faith and our relationships amongst our own families and communities.

The national cultural atmosphere is of no help either, as it is at best caustic and detrimental to accomplishing the work of evangelization, true reform, and conversion of heart to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. This culture, it must be admitted, even affects our remote and hidden location, and it wants us to shed the Christian and Catholic Faith and embrace secularism and relativism as its guide and truth. Amidst these headwinds, the diocese has embarked on a pastoral response called "the Beacons of Light." It hopes to resolve issues swirling around the reallocation of a diminishing resource of our pastors and priests serving in our Archdiocese, with the hopes of revitalizing parish life and ministries with a greater commitment to the Faith and perennial teachings of the Church.

North West Region 5 is a part of a diocesan level restructuring of the diocesan parishes from what was based around parish life of one particular community to a family of churches making up one canonical parish from various communities. We are being asked to choose our faith over our communities and embrace a larger community of fellow believers in the Catholic Faith. Despite all of these challenges and so many more unmentioned, the work in the vineyard of the Lord remains. "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Mt 28:18-20). I anticipate this will require more commitment to the faith, not less, more authentic committed leaders, not less, if we are to fulfill the work the Lord has begun in us when we were first baptized

I have always lived by the motto, "Leave it better than what you found it." In as much as I am able, I intend to do just that for the churches of the NW-5 Family of Parishes. Many answers I am seeking, for all of this has not yet been revealed to me, neither by my superiors nor in my own thoughts about this initiative we have been thrust into. I ask you to pray for me and my brother priests so that we are faithful to an interior prayer life. I find this easily forgotten aspect to be an important key to effectively lead this community through this and have us all be stronger in our faith and service to the Lord on the other side.

Much more could be said and should be said, but it will have to wait until another opportune time. There is only so much we all can digest and process at one time anyway, and I intend to respect that dynamic. As you probably noticed, I wrote this introduction slowly. It's because I know you can't read fast. Just kidding. Really and honestly though, one of my crosses in life is I hate to write out things. A weekly update in the bulletin would be a crucifixion for me, so I don't promise I will do that, but I will write in the bulletin a lot more than I have in the past and much more than I would like to. It's that pesky "pick up your cross and follow me" line in the Gospel only that impels me. In saying this, I am saying this process and venture will all require a lot of virtue from all of us if we are to be found faithful followers of our Lord Jesus Christ. If we do it in and for the Lord, we are not promised we will like it and all will be easy. He promises it will be fruitful for eternal life, and much of the fruit will be kept hidden from us in order to preserve us in His grace and mercy. God bless!

Finding our Measure in the Heart of Christ

The following article, written by Servant of God Ida Peterfy, was found in the June edition of Magnificat daily devotional.



To be present to someone is more than just to be physically pre~ sent; it is to feel with, to think with, to move with that person. It is inspired by love. When you love vou fee1 something, that feeling

bursts into action, and into words and gifts.

If that would be all there is to love, how long would that love last? Not very long. Even if we love someone very much, we are human, so what happens? There are misunderstandings, disagreements, e.g., "You let me down," "You didn't do..." There are difficulties. Is it strange that if you really love, you will go through sufferings and difficulties? No, it is not strange; it is part of love.

I would like you to know Someone I love very much. The One I love has a Sacred Heart. Sacred means "holy," which is a word for "good," a goodness we find in God alone...You cannot love someone you do not know. You get to know a person because you make an effort to know them; then the person begins to reveal himself to you. This is what is so fantastic about God; as soon as you start learning about him, getting in contact with him, your whole life changes. Why? Because all of a sudden you see how much He loves you and how much you mean to Him. If you talk about the holy heart of a person, you are not talking about a "thing" but about the person who is doing many good things because he or she has a very good heart. Look at the loving Christ who has a Sacred Heart. See the Person of our Lord—how good, loving, and accepting He is, how much He is dying to save us, how much He wants us to be united to Him.
