

GOSPEL MEDITATION

September 1, 2024 - 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Purity isn't popular at the moment. Or is it? Look at a rack of health magazines, or at popular podcasts. You'll see an infinite ocean of regulations and rituals of diets, intermittent fasting, morning sun rituals, intense juice detox practices, lists of dangerous foods, mental practices, as well as long lists of dos and don'ts for the proper cleaning of clothes, dishes, cars, houses, pets, and children. Like it or not, we long to be pure, clean, and without blemish.

This question of purity haunted people in Jesus' day, too. The Pharisees and scribes (the leading purity authorities of the day) criticize Jesus, asking, "**Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?**" (Mark 7:5). Jesus responds by saying, "**There is nothing outside the person that can defile him if it goes into him; but the things that come out of the person are what defile the person**" (Mark 7:15). What does he mean, and how can it help us be pure?

We've probably all heard the somewhat shopworn interpretation that Jesus replaces the ritual, exterior notion of purity with a moral, interior one. Christianity is thus seen as a kind of moral re-tooling, as if religion doesn't make us pure. Good moral intentions do. But this doesn't take the rest of Jesus' ministry seriously enough, nor our obsession with purity. The better reading is that Jesus audaciously offers himself as the ultimate source of human purity — from *within* each human heart. Both our religious ritual practices and our moral actions are meant to flow from this encounter with Jesus the Lord. When we are in friendship with him, everything becomes pure for us.


FINANCIAL HAPPENINGS

The fiscal year for Mary Queen of Peace Parish ended June 30, 2024, thus the 4th Quarter Report generated by the diocese reflects financial data for the entire twelve months. This report represents more than the financial position of the parish, but also reflects the efforts of the congregation to fulfill our community covenant. Highlights from these efforts are outlined below.

OPERATING REVENUE

The parish operating revenue has **stabilized** over the fiscal year due to the generous and consistent offerings from parishioners. Thank you for your **continued commitment** to the parish. Additionally, gratitude is extended to all those who volunteered their time & service for the various parish fundraisers, and to those supporting these events. Our **fundraising** efforts raised **\$62,255** throughout the 2023-2024 fiscal year.

COMPARISON OF ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUE & EXPENSES



A comparison of Operating Expenses reveals a **5% decrease** over the twelve-month period. However, a portion of this reduction in expenses is a result of **unfilled staff positions** – Pastoral Associate and Faith Formation & Evangelization Minister. Fr. Bob is looking to fill these positions in the coming months and salary **expenses will increase** accordingly.

FACILITIES

Since our 3rd Quarter report the following facilities work has been addressed:



- **St. Adalbert** – Water damage to the interior walls **has been repaired**. The repairs to the border on the church perimeter will be completed in the coming months. Currently, bids are being accepted for repairs & painting of the exterior windows.
- **St. Mary** – Repairs to the interior wall behind the altar **have been completed**. The columns & wall at the back of the church will be repaired later this year. Exterior work – pointing and painting doors & windows – will continue in the fall. Drawings and industrial engineer reports for the reconfiguration of the St. Mary rectory are in the final stages.
- **Parish Center** – During the heat spells this summer, it became apparent that the aged air conditioning unit is **no longer effectively operating**. Plans are being reviewed to replace the system before next summer.

A special thanks to our **Cleaning Ministry** who maintained the churches throughout the renovations. And, thank you to the **Garden Ministry** who exceeded expectations in the beautification of our grounds during a hot summer


