



From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Good news for us as Catholics, 2020 ends sooner than it does for everyone else! The First Sunday of Advent begins a new Church year. We begin the Liturgical Year of 2021, Year B, Cycle One. *Year B* indicates that in the Liturgical Year we primarily hear Gospel passages from Mark—though we get a Chapter 6 of John late in the summer months. (Remember: Year A is Matthew and Year C is Luke.) *Cycle I* mean that we are in the first of the two volumes of the daily Mass readings. In both I and II the Gospels are the same, but the first readings from either the Old Testament or the non-Gospel New Testament differ.

I like the way that the year is sometimes called, *The Year of Grace 2021*. This is a reminder that God is always at work. As we go from Advent to Christmas to Lent to Easter and add the Ordinary Time, we see that the Liturgical Year plays out God’s interaction with us in time. His interaction is grace, the sharing in God’s life. We have another year of sacraments. We have another year of prayer. We have another year of service to our brothers and sisters in need. God is at work in His Church.

He is at work in each of us. This new liturgical year is an invitation to each of us to make this year a year of grace, to enter deeper into the life of God. It may be asking us to stop something. It may be asking us to begin something. We might come to Mass and confession more than we had. We might find a way to share more of our time/talent/treasure. We might find 5 more minutes a day, or a week for prayer. Maybe this is the year to get involved at the parish or in community spirit.

There may be some challenges, setbacks, or losses for you. The saints teach us that we can see these moments as moments of grace. They point to The Cross, the painful death of The Lord, which became the source of grace. Many of you, like myself, have been at the deathbed of a loved one. It is an overwhelming sadness, but to be there as that loved one goes to meet the Lord is also a moment of grace.

Grace is all around us. It is in us. Because God is all around us and in us. Bring on 2021!

Handling our Christmas project during a pandemic is going to be a challenge but we have worked out a way to do it. The plan is to provide gifts for children and handicapped adults at our sister parish of St. Boniface, CRS Santa’s Workshop, 4 group homes from Our Lady of the Wayside, and 50 children whose parents are in prison. We will do all of this and still

keep our parishioners and volunteers safe!

Here’s the plan:

Wish List tags and mittens will be posted on bulletin boards in Fr. Mosovsky Hall starting November 14. The early start date is to give our parishioners extra time to shop. Fr. Mosovsky Hall will be open during the week starting Saturday, November 14 through Friday, December 11 from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. You may go to Fr. Mosovsky Hall before and after Saturday afternoon Mass and Sunday morning Masses also. Those who can pick up tags and mittens during the week are encouraged to do so. Please be patient—we can only have a few people in the Hall at one time.

Please shop for and wrap gifts as early as possible. When the gifts are ready to return, please take them to Fr. Mosovsky Hall and our volunteers will sort them. The Hall will have signs to direct you where to place the gifts. Please return the [CRS gifts by December 6](#) and all the other gifts no later than Monday, December 14—earlier is always a help!

Masks and social distancing are required. Our volunteers will be fewer this year, so please be patient with us.

Thank you for your generosity! This program is so important to so many children and adults. We can do this in a manner that keeps everyone safe!




REFLECT

FIRST READING

We hear today the prophet Isaiah's internal spiritual struggle as he questions God's ways and decries our human tendency to sin. What spiritual struggles do you need to confront as we enter into the season of Advent?

SECOND READING

In his opening words to the Corinthian Christians, Paul reminds the faithful of God's fidelity to those who believe in his Son. He then cites examples of the blessings they have received since coming to the faith. What are some blessings you have received in your faith journey?

GOSPEL READING

Jesus instructs his disciples to be vigilant for the end times. How can you make this spiritual discipline a focus of your Advent season this year?

GOSPEL MEDITATION
 ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

You are at the eye doctor and it's time for the peripheral vision test. You know the one. It's where you put your head up to a contraption and have to click a switch every time you see a squiggly line. If you don't concentrate and maintain optimal focus, you will miss them and skew the outcome of the test. You can easily find yourself with a diagnosis that really isn't accurate! Concentration and focus are key to succeeding with this evaluation. They are also key to developing a healthy, vibrant spiritual life. If we do not bring our full consciousness to the task, concentrate with all our might, be watchful and vigilant, we are not going to see God's loving presence flashing before our eyes!

That's why we need Advent. Let's face it. We can easily get distracted, focus on nonessential and superficial things and lose touch with what really matters. Our attentions wander. We daydream and even become a bit overwhelmed and tired. All of the stresses and demands of life consume us and we find ourselves constantly trying to play catch up rather than relishing the moment of the now. "Now" moments are



so fleeting. They flash before us like those squiggly lines on a screen. Present moments go as quickly as they come but it is important to discover them and rest in them as often as we can. Though gone in a flash, these now moments of encounter with God teach powerful lessons and offer a grounding in truth that can be found nowhere else. It's the grace of Advent to become watchful and attentive because we are never sure when God will surprise us.

God loves surprises and love thrives on them! God's now moments of surprises come

as tender instants of intimate connection where I find profound peace, experience joy, and rest in love. These are Advent times reflective of the now moments when Christ first was born, when God surprises us during every time we care to watch and when the great surprise of Christ's second coming dawns upon us all. But, to discover the grandeur and experience the awe of these now times, we have to be ready. We have to want to be there. We have to believe. And, we have to have the desire to soak in as much as we can in the time we have before us.



The weekly television Mass produced by the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland is moving.

Starting on Nov. 22, the Sunday television Mass will be seen at 10 a.m. on [WUAB Channel 43](#), the CW. This change provides viewers with an opportunity to take part in the weekly celebration of the Mass at a much more convenient time. In addition, WUAB Channel 43 is an over-the-air station that is accessible even to those without cable TV. Those with cable TV need only to check their local cable system listings to determine where WUAB is located on their local channel line-up.

The weekly TV Mass is produced by the Diocese of Cleveland and it originates from the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in downtown Cleveland. The televised Mass has been a staple of religious programming on Northeast Ohio airwaves for decades, cultivating a dedicated and faithful following. It is hoped that viewers will continue to tune in on this new station at this new, more convenient time.

The TV Mass also can be accessed on demand starting Saturday evening and running throughout Sunday on the Diocese of Cleveland website, dioceseofcleveland.org. In addition, the Mass can be heard on the radio, at 4 p.m. Saturdays and 10:30 a.m. Sundays on [AM 1260 The Rock](#). Also, radio station [WINT-1330 AM](#) airs the Mass at 9 a.m. each Sunday and [Cox Communications](#) cable subscribers can view the Mass at 11:30 a.m. Sunday on channel 45.

First Sunday of Advent—November 29, 2020—The Advent wreath is a symbol of our longing for Christ's coming. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. There may be three violet and one rose, or four violet or four white candles may also be used. Evergreens on an Advent wreath are symbols of God's enduring promise of redemption. The circle shape signifies our hope for the return of Christ, whose Kingdom has no end. The candles match the colors of the vestments for the four Sunday of Advent: violet for penance, and rose on the third Sunday for joy that the season is nearly over. If you are setting up an Advent wreath in your home this year, here is a prayer that you can say while you light its candles. Many families light the candles during the evening meal, or you may do it at a more convenient time. Before you say the

following prayer for the first week, you may wish to read aloud the and discuss the Gospel reading you heard at Sunday Mass this week: Mark 13:33-37.

Prayer for the First Week of Advent

O God, who asks us to be watchful and alert because we do not know when you will come, let this candle give us light and help us stay awake. At those times when you ask us to act, give us strength to respond at once. We ask this through Christ our Lord. AMEN.
