From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

The pages of the Gospel show clearly how special was that love for children which Christ showed while He was on earth. It was His delight to be in their midst; He was wont to lay His hands on them; He embraced them; and He blessed them. At the same time He was not pleased when they would be driven away by the disciples, whom He rebuked gravely with these words: "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for of such is the kingdom of God." It is clearly seen how highly He held their innocence and the open simplicity of their souls on that occasion when He called a little child to Him and said to the disciples: "Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like little children, you will not enter into the kingdom of heaven...And whoever receives one such little child for my sake, receives me."

--Pope Pius X Quam Singulari (which lowered the age for children in the Latin Church to receive First Eucharist to around the age of seven.)

Today is Holy Spirit's 1st Communion day. Many of our second graders will receive Jesus for the first time in the Eucharist at the 10:30 and Noon Masses. This has been an unusual year for their preparation for this Sacrament. Their preparation was primarily carried out by their parents, whom the Church calls "primary and principal educators" of their children in the ways of faith (cf. Second Vatican Council: Decl. Gravissimum educationis, n. 3). This was a different model than the classroom model for education with which most of us are familiar and have experienced. Covid has pushed all of us to find new ways of doing the old things.

These children's excitement in receiving Jesus in the Eucharist should be contagious. They remind us of how important the Eucharist is in the life of Catholic Christians. We should want to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. This celebration reminds us that being in the church and celebrating with the community is superior to watching Mass on a screen; that receiving Jesus in the Eucharist is superior to watching Mass with a cup of coffee.

I look forward to the day when the dispensation from attending Sunday Mass is no longer granted by the Bishop. When that day comes, as has always been the case, if your health or the care for another's health prevents you from attending Mass, there is no sin involved with not fulfilling the Sunday obligation. Comfort and convenience are not reason enough. A rule of thumb I use is to ask: Does the reason that am absenting myself from Sunday Mass keep me from doing other things such as shopping, or going to entertainment, or out to a restaurant that day? As more people are returning to the "normal" activities of life, especially because of vaccinations, Sunday Mass should be one of the normal activities for Catholics. I do note the increase in the last month of the number of people at Mass; we had a number in the high-300s at weekend Masses through the best of the Covid weeks, we are now up to the mid-400s. It is good to see so many people back. I know there are others who wish to be here; we look forward with you to the day you can do so.

We congratulate these children receiving 1st Communion. We share in their joy as they receive the Sacrament for the first time. May we be as joyful on our 10,000th time.


