




Act of Spiritual Communion

From the Pastor

“For it is testified: ‘You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek.’” (Hebrews 7:17)

Dear Parishioners,

Late last Sunday night, I got word that Fr. Dan Redmond, pastor of St. Mary Church, Chardon; a brother priest; a peer (we are about the same age)--and a friend--died suddenly and unexpectedly at his rectory, a few weeks short of his 25th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. I ask for your prayers for this faithful priest and for his devastated family, especially his father, Brian.

Fr. Redmond's death, so near his anniversary and my approaching anniversary, has me thinking about priesthood and vocations. We lose one tragically and we greet four joyfully. This weekend, the diocese will welcome four new “baby priests”: Frs. Alexander Clark, Cameron Popik, Alexander Spenik, and James Winings. Fr. Clark served as an intern at St. Joseph Parish and lived with Fr. Ron, Dan, and me as part of his seminary training. Fr. Popik was a young boy at my first assignment, St. Joseph, Strongsville.

I am also thrilled that my very good friends' (with whom I have dinner most Sundays and days off) son, Stephen Vavro, is entering Borromeo next year. I know from experience that it is a long 9-years from the doors of Borromeo to the floor of the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. I saw many classmates come and go (I was the only one from my class who started first semester freshman year and was ordained nine years later.) The important thing is, we still have men willing to consider and discern a vocation to the priesthood. In addition to Fr. Ron Wearsch, Dan Schlegel, and Terry Grachanin, my hope is that we can add to the list of priestly vocations in service to the Diocese of Cleveland coming from Holy Spirit Parish. Let us encourage vocations and pray for those responding to the call:

Lord Jesus Christ, eternal High Priest, You offered yourself to the Father on the altar of the cross and through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit gave Your priestly people a share in Your redeeming sacrifice. Hear our prayer for the sanctification of our priests. Grant that all who are ordained to the ministerial priesthood may be ever more conformed to You, the Divine Master. May they preach the Gospel with pure heart and clear conscience. Let them be shepherds according to Your own Heart, single-minded in service to You and to the Church and shining examples of a holy, simple and joyful life. Through the prayers of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Your Mother and ours, strip up the hearts of all those discerning the priesthood and give them the courage and fortitude to respond to this call. Draw all priests and the flocks entrusted to their care to the fullness of eternal life where you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. But grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore, it says:

*He ascended on high and took prisoners captive;
he gave gifts to men.*

What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended into the lower regions of the earth? The one who descended is also the one who ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.

And he gave some as apostles, others as prophets, others as evangelists, others as pastors and teachers, to equip the holy ones for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of faith and knowledge of the Son of God, to mature to manhood, to the extent of the full stature of Christ. Mark 16:15-20

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Jesus said to his disciples: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



Our parish programs are always dependent upon the generosity of our people. For all that you have done, both in volunteering and in financial support, I am truly grateful. **OUR TEACHERS HAVE BEEN THE BEST!**

I come to you begging once more! I appreciate that everyone has many demands upon their time these days and that Covid-19 is still a reality. **BUT I NEED YOUR HELP!** During the past three years, I have tried to be responsive to both the Diocese's requirements and our families' needs for a flexible religious education program. 

CRS requests the following items of need; -fresh fruit, produce, snacks and juice boxes for children, peanut butter and jelly or jam, toiletry items, cleaning supplies, liquid laundry detergent (40oz or less), diapers (size 4, 5 or 6), incontinence supplies for adults, large food collection bags, (eg. 18 by 12 inches). Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2021 Spring Campaign of 40 Days for Life. God blessed the campaign and we know 755 babies, mothers, fathers and families were spared from abortion, 7 more abortion workers experienced conversion, and 3 more abortion facilities closed. Praise God! Cumulatively over the 14 years of 40 Days for Life, there have been 18,745 babies spared from abortion, 217 converted abortion workers, and 110 abortion facility closures. Praise God! We look forward to praying with you from September 22 – October 31 in the 2021 Fall Campaign. God bless you and thank you.


Mother's Day weekend through Father's Day weekend, June 19th/20th

There are also some duties during Mass as well as clean-up after Mass. You may also be called upon to help with hospitality ministry (being a greeter) before Mass as time and talent allows. New volunteers will be trained by a current sacristan before beginning this ministry on your own. Sacristans don't need to serve every week, but a commitment of at least once a month would be appreciated, as well as being available for some Holy Days. You must be an adult and a confirmed member of the parish. Husband and wife teams are welcome!
