Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Solemnity of Pentecost, the last day of the Easter Season. It is our Parish's Patronal Feast Day, and an important day in the life of a parish. It is also, as it often is the case, the day Holy Spirit Parish has its annual celebration of Confirmation. Bishop Roger Gries, retired Auxiliary Bishop of Cleveland, will be confirming 40 of our young men and women at the Noon Mass.

Last year, due to COVID and Bishop Perez having been transferred to Philadelphia, pastors in the Diocese of Cleveland were given the ability to confirm their own parishioners. I really enjoyed being able to celebrate this sacrament with our students. I offer you some of the points I shared with them. These points are good reminders to all of us who have received the Holy Spirit in Confirmation.

Many of us, when learning to ride a bike, start off riding a bike with training wheels. It was a bike, but not the fullness of what a bike is supposed to be. When we are baptized, we are Christians, and nothing can change that. But we are not as fully Christian as we should be until we are confirmed. Thus Confirmation is counted with Baptism and Eucharist as the "Sacraments of Initiation." Baptism starts you off in the Christian life; Confirmation completes Baptism. It is when we are Confirmed that the training wheels come off!

When learning to ride a bike, you don't take off the training wheels and then put the bike in the garage, not to use it again. It is meant to be used. Confirmation is not graduation and is not the end of our Christian education. We are meant to keep learning about and living out our faith.

When the training wheels come off, it is the time for you to go farther than you have been able to go before. We are able to go to new places with our faith. We are called to take our faith with us into marriage, Holy Orders, or religious life. We are called to take our faith with us to work, to school, to our family and friends. There is no place where we should leave our faith behind. Like having a bike, we can go farther and faster with our faith than without.

If we fall off a bike, we don't throw away the bike. We get back on and ride. If we fall away from our faith, it stays there waiting for us to get on again.

We pray for and congratulate those being confirmed. May their Confirmation remind us to live out ours.


