## **From the Pastor**

"May all your troubles last as long as your New Year's resolutions!"—Joey Adams

#### **Dear Parishioners:**

I'm not one for New Year's resolutions. They are often made based on what we have been doing in the last weeks and especially the week before—usually eating and eating. Resolutions go unmet for a period of time and are discarded. People make the resolution to exercise in the New Year and then by February the new gym equipment becomes a new clothes rack. The gyms and makers of gym equipment count on this.

I am also suspicious of religious New Year's resolutions. This is not because decisions to pray more, to read scripture, to get to confession more often, to read the bible, to serve others, especially those in need, etc. are bad. It is the approach that is problematic. People start to do these things, then life intervenes, and they drop their resolve to do it.

I suggest that we instead make a "New Day's resolution." We wake each day to a new day and resolve to do a particular action in our Christian life. If we achieve it that day, great. If not, then go to bed, wake up, and make a new resolution.

Doing it in this way makes us less likely just to give up the whole endeavor. Starting new each day tells us not to worry if we've failed in the past. That was yesterday; this is today, a new day to start anew!




