Dear Parishioners:

January 15, 2018. That was the day I began as pastor of Holy Spirit. Having completed 4 years as pastor, I am going into my fifth year. I really think of it as 4* years. *Two of those years have most definitely **not** been business as usual. The pandemic has made those years seem to be a holding pattern. We have carried on, and some things have changed, but it has been a time for waiting and not for pressing forward. Though those years have been trying in many ways, I am glad to have spent them as your pastor.

I see the pandemic as the temporary time. I look forward to putting it into the past *because I am excited about the future. I am enthusiastic about where we are going and where we can go.*

I see good things all around: the amazing support of the parishioners for the parish, the Repairs and Improvements, and the Heart of the Shepherd; the on-going commitment to charitable works; new faces and young faces and the faithful faces have been here at Mass on Sunday; there are new people getting involved in serving the parish; the energy and enthusiasm and effort of the recently-renewed parish staff.

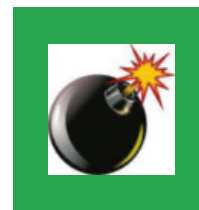
