

**ORDINARY TIME SOUNDS
LIKE MORE OF THE SAME
BUT...**

The children in the atrium sing a song about the colors of the Liturgical Year.

"Purple and green, red and white are the colors of the year. Purple and green, red and white help us see the Light."

The children know that the "Light" they sing about is Jesus - the Light of the world.

The song goes on: "Purple's for preparation, white is for celebration, green is for Ordinary Time, red is for Pentecost."

So why green? The children (beginning at 3 years of age) are told that green is for growing. Ordinary Time is a time for us to grow.

How are we supposed to grow? Our readings in ordinary time concentrate on Jesus' mission, what the Apostles are doing, and how the people who are experiencing the Word are changing and growing. We learn from those who experienced Jesus.

We need to do the same. Just as the followers of Jesus changed how they viewed themselves and one another, we must also find out how and why we need to change. Listening to the readings at Mass, following along with a Bible study, learning, reading the Catechism, learning more about the lives and writings of the Saints, and searching out good Catholic media are all ways for us to learn what truly is the way Jesus wants us to live and how He wants us to treat one another; those close by and those farther away.

This "Ordinary Time" can bring you to an extraordinary place in following our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Dear Parish Family,

Continuing on from last week's bulletin article, I'd like to share with you some more details on the **Synod: For a Synodal Church** called for by Pope Francis.

Why Now? - "The decision to Journey together' is a prophetic sign for the human family, which needs a shared project capable of pursuing the good of all... We need to let ourselves be educated by the Spirit to a truly synodal mentality, entering with courage and freedom of heart into a **conversion process** that is indispensable for the '**continual reformation of which [the Church] always has need**, in so far as she is a human institution'" (Synod 2023 Preparatory Document, no. 9).

Role of the Parish - Parishes are encouraged to make use of existing "synodal" bodies, such as the Pastoral Council and other ministry groups, to organize, facilitate, and give life to

the Synodal Process in the faith community, while also reaching out to those voices that are seldom heard. The feedback received throughout the listening process should be gathered into a "synthesis" and submitted to the diocesan leadership team sometime in March of 2022.

Nativity of the Lord Jesus - Our parish has already begun these prayerful listening sessions and will be offering open-parish sessions (45mins.) in the Holy Family Room on:
 Saturday, **January 29th**, at 5:30pm – after Mass
 Sunday, **January 30th**, at 9:30am – in between Masses
 Monday, **January 31st**, at 6:30pm

Anyone may attend one of these sessions (they are all the same, so only attend one). We appreciate your participation!

TIDBITS FROM THE CHURCH MOUSE



Hi Folks,

I snuggled into my nice warm bed after being out on one of those freezing days last week. As I started drifting off to sleep, I began to remember a warm day last summer when I was playing Hide and Seek. Stubby was "IT" and hid his eyes as the rest of us scurried off to find the best hiding spot.

I hid behind one of the big trees near the rectory, so I was sure he would never find me. I was patting myself on the back for being so smart; when suddenly, I noticed a snake coming straight towards me. I let out a holler and jumped out into the open.

Stubby yelled, "Gotcha, Chatter!"

"Wait, there was a snake coming right at me," I protested. "I want a do over."

"No way," said Stubby.

"Why not?" I insisted. "Even some of the pro-athletes get do overs. If the offense in football is called for holding, they lose 10 yards, but they get to repeat the down. Fan interference can also cause a replay in some sports." Stubby wasn't buying it. He said that Hide and Seek isn't a sport, so I lost fair and square.

Begrudgingly, I accepted my defeat, and finished a few more rounds of Hide and Seek. But later that night, I started thinking about how God even allows do overs. When Adam and Eve sinned, God kicked them out of paradise, but He

allowed them to begin a new life in the ordinary world. (Too bad that He even allowed the serpent to live.) Then God made a restart of the whole world with the great flood and the occupants of Noah's ark. Obviously, God is OK with giving second chances.

Then, Jesus came into the world, and He also followed His father's lead. When He saved the woman who was being stoned for impurity, He gave her a second chance to change her life. When He cured a leper, a person who was blind, or lame, or dying—Jesus gave them the opportunity to start fresh with a new life.

I think that Jesus did the most genius thing of instituting the sacraments that allow people for all generations to have new starts. Baptism gives people a new life with a spotless soul. Confession brings forgiveness and counsel for self-improvement. Confirmation instills the Holy Spirit to strengthen and guide. Holy Orders and Matrimony transform a person to a new vocation of priesthood, or married spouse. It seems that God is trying to share some of His power to help people have a do over and become the best version of themselves.

Giving people second chances seems to matter a lot to God. Maybe that is a good way to let Christ shine through me by showing helpful kindness to others. It seems that Jesus offered us do overs as an example of how we can offer them to others.

The Bible and Mass

What is unique or different about the way Catholics read and are exposed to the Bible?

Catholics are exposed to Scripture primarily through the Sunday readings from a book known as the Lectionary. The Lectionary is a book of selected passages from the Bible set in the context of a liturgical season, such as Advent, Lent, or Ordinary Time. There are four readings assigned to any Sunday: the first reading (usually from the Old Testament), the responsorial psalm, the second reading (usually from a New Testament letter), and the Gospel reading.

These readings together give them a new context. The selected readings relate to one another in a unique manner that is not present in the Bible text itself. In close proximity to each other, these readings now have the opportunity to converse with each other in a way that would have not been possible before. A homilist pays attention to all four readings, preparing a reflection that speaks of this conversation among the readings, enabling us to zero in on what this unique combination of God's word has to say to us this particular Sunday.

Next time you attend Sunday liturgy, try reading the Scripture ahead of time and see how this new relationship among the readings addresses and challenges you to be a better Christian here and now.
