SICK CALLS: Inform the Rectory Office of the ill and homebound.





PASTOR'S NOTES

The Lord be with you!

As we return to Ordinary Time, it is good for us to reflect on more mundane problems. It so happens that our next few questions on Confession go over a somewhat common problem: what do I need to confess?

Question 780. What sins are we bound to confess?

Answer. We are bound to confess all our mortal sins, but it is well also to confess our venial sins.

Question 781. Why is it well to confess also the venial sins we remember?

Answer. It is well to confess also the venial sins we remember: (1) Because it shows our hatred of all sin, and (2) Because it is sometimes difficult to determine just when a sin is venial and when mortal.

Question 782. What should one do who has only venial sins to confess?

Answer. One who has only venial sins to confess should tell also some sin already confessed in his past life for which he knows he is truly sorry; because it is not easy to be truly sorry for slight sins and imperfections, and yet we must be sorry for the sins confessed that our confession may be valid -- hence we add some past sin for which we are truly sorry to those for which we may not be sufficiently sorry.

Question 783. Should a person stay from confession because he thinks he has no sin to confess?

Answer. A person should not stay from confession because he thinks he has no sin to confess, for the Sacrament of Penance, besides forgiving sin, gives an increase of sanctifying grace, and of this we have always need, especially to resist temptation. The Saints, who were almost without imperfection, went to confession frequently.

Question 784. Should a person go to Communion after confession even when the confessor does not bid him go?

Answer. A person should go to Communion after confession even when the confessor does not bid him go, because the confessor so intends unless he positively forbids his penitent to receive Communion. However, one who has not yet received his first Communion should not go to Communion after confession, even if the confessor by mistake should bid him go.

My commentary.

Regarding Questions 780 and 781, confessing venial sins is a good idea because it helps us to work against them. One of the effects of Reconciliation is honesty. The more honest we are with God, the more honest we can be with ourselves. Confessing our sins strengthens our resolve by healing our minds from the lies we tend to tell ourselves.

I always wondered where the practice of confessing past sins came from, and now I know: Question 782. To be absolutely clear, what this question proposes is a pious practice that may be done, but need not. In fact, I would generally recommend not confessing past sins that have already been confessed. Merely confessing venial sins is sufficient for the sacrament to be effective. If someone cannot remember any sin in particular, it is acceptable to confess a past sin as well as a general sorrow for sins.

Question 783 brings up the topic of how frequently we should go to Confession. I have always recommended that, all things being equal, once a season is a good measure. If you have been in the habit of going more often - say monthly or every two weeks - stick to that! It is better to err and go to Penance more often than to neglect it.

Lastly, Question 784 captures the reticence that many had for receiving Holy Communion. As many know, before the Second Vatican Council, many Catholics stayed away from frequent Communion. Very long fast times and an emphasis on being free of any sin (venial or mortal) discouraged people from Communion. Ironically, the number of Communions is still low today. Today's problem is an inverse of the old. Whereas before we had 70% of Catholics coming to Mass, but only 10% of those receiving Communion, today less than 20% attend Mass weekly but of those almost everyone goes to Communion.

The more we worthily receive Holy Communion, the more we will detest our sins and seek Confession. Likewise, the more we repent from our sins through Penance, the more we will desire union with God. Both Reconciliation and the Eucharist enable us to love more deeply, but each has its proper role in the life of grace.

ASK FATHER

Question: "Why have you been commenting on the *Baltimore Catechism* and not the more recent *Catechism of the Church?*

Catechism of the Church?

Answer: Why comment on the Baltimore Catechism in general and why do that instead of commenting on the Catechism of the Catholic



commenting on the Catechism of the Catholic Church in particular? First, to the best of my knowledge, no one in English has taken the time to comment and revise the statements from the *Baltimore Catechism* in a systematic way. Since entire generations were taught with this catechism, it is pastorally appropriate to build upon what others already know. Second, in commenting on this catechism, I am creating an instrument to help future generations understand how the Church's popular theology has changed over the last sixty years. Third, from a structural perspective, the *Baltimore* Catechism tends to be very practical but too succinct so that further explanations are often needed. The Catechism of the Catholic Church is not nearly as practical, but it has plenty of self-commentary. In other words, The Catechism of the Catholic Church is so well made that all I would be doing is going, "Yes, good answer" in my comments. I will admit that I severely underestimated how much commenting would be needed. While the Catechism of the Church is the best in terms of theology, the most accessible catechism of late is the YOUCAT or Youth Catechism.
