

Sing to the Lord a New Song

This Wednesday, February 2, the Church celebrates the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also known as Candlemas day. Traditionally on this day, people would bring to church their candles which would be used throughout the coming year in their homes and workplaces. The priest would bless the candles and recall how on this date the light of the world, Jesus Christ, was presented in the Temple by his parents. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* n. 529 teaches us that the Presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Father. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the "light of the nations" and the "glory of Israel."

February 2 is also the World Day for Consecrated Life. Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a day for women and men in consecrated life in 1997, and it has ever since been celebrated annually. It is an opportunity for us to pray in gratitude for the example of religious sisters, nuns, monks, brothers, and priests who have cared for the sick, taught in our schools and universities, contemplated the heavenly mysteries, established orphanages and social service networks, and preached the Gospel at home and abroad – in short, the Church owes a huge debt of gratitude to our religious women and men.

Young people continue to discern a life of service in the Church. According to the National Religious Vocation Conference, on average, around 200 people a year make perpetual profession (final vows), and about 400 begin the process of becoming religious sisters, nuns, brothers, or priests, known as initial formation. Of those new entrants, about 70% considered religious life before age 21. The rate of those entering formation has remained consistent in the past decade and represents a leveling off from a decline at the end of the prior century.

We have much to celebrate in gratitude for the presence and ministry of religious women and men in our Diocese, and in our parish, including our very own Sister Jeanne Cmolik, CSJ, who continues to generously serve and coordinate the RCIA program here at St. Christopher. May the good Lord continue to bless those in consecrated life, and all who are discerning a vocation of service in the Church. Amen!




THANK GOD IT'S FIRST FRIDAY -WEST



- **Substitute:** Rather than work on a weekly schedule, you can substitute occasionally when regular kitchen workers or drivers need to take time off.
- **Special events worker:** Help represent our program at bake sales, fund raisers, outreach efforts, community events, parades, and more.
