

We will properly dispose of these blessed sacramentals by burning them during the Lenten season.




“CANDLEMAS” THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD


BIBLE STUDY

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON ED

We are officially one month into 2021 and we are still wondering what this year will bring. Think about this time last year, who would have imagined how the rest of 2020 would unfold? Certainly it is in God's hands and the future is unfolding according to God's plan, but each of us can make a difference.

Lets take a look at what one event, we know will occur:

Pope Francis is going to visit Iraq this year, a trip that was postponed from 2020 because of the pandemic. This trip is vital to the Christian minority of the region, where Muslim belief and politics dominate the happenings and laws. Iraq's Archbishop Bashar Warda has stated that this visit could be an important turning point for the diminishing Christian presence in the region.

Iraq has biblical roots that most of us should be familiar with:

- *Iraq is called the "Cradle of Civilization" where there is evidence of the earliest writing systems, urban centers, literature, science, medicine and business, referenced in Genesis.
- *Ancient names for parts of Iraq include; Mesopotamia, Shinar, Chaldea, Babylon and Assyria in the North.
- *The ancient language of Akkadian, named after the city of Akkad, which was founded by Nimrod (Genesis 10:10).
- *There are thousands of archaeological sites with biblical connection.
- *Ur is located in the southern region, which was the home of Abraham.
- *Babylon was located about 25 miles south of Baghdad. It was the capital of the Babylonia empire, which ruled the ancient world from 612 to 539 BC.
- *Ancient city of Nineveh is located near Mosul. The walled city enclosed 1700 acres, so when Jonah arrived in the eighth century BC, it took him three days to cross the city. (Jonah 3:3)
- *Recent wars and civil strife have destroyed the Nation Museum in Baghdad, which held 170,000 artifacts of antiquity from the very dawn of the regions history.

I mention the above information to show the challenges faced by Pope Francis, upon his visit. There will be much mistrust, anger and resentment among the population for the leader of the Christian world to deal with. The trip is planned for March 5-8 and it will be historic for the Christian world, which dates its biblical origins to this region, as well as in Judea, to the south, where Jesus began his ministry.

The visit from the pope can have tremendous effects on inter-religious relations as we continue to work toward peaceful relationships and make meaningful changes in the world.

The first reading this week from Deuteronomy, "I shall raise up a prophet like you from among their kin and he will put my words into his mouth, he shall tell them all that I command him." It sounds like the Lord will guide Pope Francis into this region with the wisdom of the Holy Spirit to guide him.

Making peace a priority should be on everyone's mind.

The question we should be asking ourselves this week is, 'how far should I go to bring more peace into this world?'

Is there someone in your life that has wronged you, or perhaps you have offended?

Has an event in your life left you restless, and unable to find peace in your heart?

There is no better time than now to extend a hand of peace, a kind word or gesture to improve this world.

What will you do?

Will you be a peacemaker?

Will you help make 2021 a better year?


