



In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem.

Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place.

But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy.

Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem,

set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects.

Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons

until the kingdom of the Persians came to power.

All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah:

"Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled."

In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah,

the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing:

"Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia:

All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah.

Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people,

let him go up, and may his God be with him!"



FROM THE DESK OF DEACON ED

"Whoever lives the truth comes to the light. So that his works may be clearly seen as done in God."

The words from John's Gospel today reflect on our faith-filled desire to know God, know our purpose in this world and to live in the light of Christ.



Throughout the last 2000 years, men and women have felt the desire to know something deeper about their lives. People have searched for meaning and purpose to life and the quest to explore a relationship with the creator. After our Lord's resurrection, the apostles went out into Judea, then later into the 'known world' to spread the Good News to all who would listen. The conversion of Gentiles became more popular, and so the formation of the "Catechumenate" as we know it, became more comprehensive in the first two hundred years of our church history. Once Christianity became legal in 315AD under Emperor Constantine, the magisterium of the church, formed the structure of the entrance process into the church. From those early years, through the Middle Ages and up until Vatican II, various forms of adult education and reception of the sacraments for adults evolved. In 1972, the promulgation of the order of Christian Initiation of Adults came into being, then in 1974, the English translation of the RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS was published. The year 1988 had the United States bishops implemented the final translation that is used today.

So much for the history lesson!

Over the years you may have noticed the RCIA process of our parish with photos in the connecting lobby of adults walking the journey of faith toward the Easter Vigil. At various stages, the candidates are welcomed and scrutinized at the weekend mass times. And every year we welcome adults seeking to enter the Catholic Church, educated by attending weekly sessions that begin in September and culminate at the Easter Vigil.

I was richly blessed to have had Sr. Thelma Gearhart as my mentor, as I walked the RCIA journey with about 100 people since the early-1990's. This year, I feared that the pandemic would stifle those seeking the sacraments, but through faith, we have had three adults, bravely responding to the call.


The Lenten Season is a time where the RCIA candidates make final preparations for the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil, which is one of the most beautiful liturgies of the year. Please keep **Amanda Varn, Brad Pollard and Loren Reash-Henz** in your prayers, as they will be welcomed into our church on that holy night. They have worked very hard to learn our beliefs, understand the faith and deepen their knowledge of what God is asking of them.

If you have never attended the Easter Vigil, I would highly recommend you experiencing this beautiful liturgy at least once in your life. The liturgy begins outside with the blessing of fire, procession into a dark church (thus it must begin after sundown, 8:15 PM this year), each person holding a candle, the Easter proclamation, the baptism of the adults, the confirming of the adults and reception of their first Eucharist. Our music director, Jennifer Broeren, enriches the liturgy with beautiful song to inspire all those present. The mass ends late, but all those present know they have experienced something very special.

May you too, have the light come into your world as we approach Easter and may you be richly blessed for your unwavering faith in God and His Holy Church.


