

**THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH**  
**“15 Ways to gain an Indulgence in the Year of St. Joseph” From Catholic News Agency, By Courtney Mares**

Until December 2021, there are many new ways that Catholics can receive an indulgence, including entrusting their daily work to the protection of St. Joseph the Worker or reciting the rosary with their families. These acts must be accompanied by sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, prayer for the pope’s intentions, the usual conditions to obtain any plenary

indulgence. Plenary indulgences remit all temporal punishment due to sin and must be accompanied by full detachment from sin. According to the decree issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary on Dec. 8, the ways to receive an indulgence in the Year of St. Joseph: (several of which have already passed the date) 1. Participate in a spiritual retreat for at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph.

2. Pray for St. Joseph’s intercession for the unemployed that they might find dignifying work.
3. Recite the Litany of St. Joseph for persecuted Christians.
4. Entrust one’s daily work and activity to the protection of St. Joseph the Worker.
5. Follow St. Joseph’s example in performing a corporal work of mercy.
6. Perform one of the spiritual works of mercy
7. Pray the rosary together with one’s family in order that “all Christian families may be stimulated to recreate the same atmosphere of intimate communion, love and prayer that was in the Holy Family.”
8. Engaged couples can also receive an indulgence from praying the rosary together.
9. Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord’s Prayer, because St. Joseph “invites us to rediscover our filial relationship with the Father, to renew fidelity to prayer, to listen and correspond with profound discernment to God’s will.”
10. Pray an approved prayer to St. Joseph on St. Joseph Sunday, the Sunday after Christmas in the Byzantine Catholic tradition.
11. Pray an approved prayer to St. Joseph on the 19th of any month.
12. Honor Joseph with an act of piety or approved prayer on a Wednesday, the day traditionally dedicated to St. Joseph.
13. Celebrate the feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1 with an act of piety or prayer.” The decree noted that in this instance the person must have the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions for an indulgence, as well as a detachment from sin. *Borrowed with permission*







**FROM THE DESK OF DARLENE HEIGL, THE OFFICE MANAGER**

Boy, it's been crazy the last couple of months with the United States Postal Service being so slow. Many of us still haven't received our monthly offertory envelopes. They are coming in slowly, but surely. Hang in there, they will arrive! In the meantime, here are some reminders regarding our offertory envelopes:

If you have not received your pre-printed offertory envelopes through the mail yet, please use a plain white envelope. Write your name, your envelope number (if you know it), date, and contribution amount.

If you contribute to many different funds:

A separate check or cash is needed for the Renovation Fund because this fund has it's own bank account.

A separate check or cash is needed for the Scholarship Fund because this fund has it's own bank account.

All of the other funds can be lumped together with one check or cash with a notation of how the contribution is divided with fund name and amount. This is one bank account and the money gets divided by fund within our software program, then sent to the appropriate charity.

If you are mailing your offertory envelopes, it is not necessary to send all the envelopes in from the different months of contribution. Simply write all the dates your contribution covers on one envelope and mail.
