




SUMMER BREAK SUNDAY EVENING MASS



WAYS TO RECEIVE AN INDULGENCE IN THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH:



- 1) Participate in a spiritual retreat for at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph.
- 2) Pray for St. Joseph's intercession for the unemployed that they might find dignifying work.
- 3) Recite the Litany of St. Joseph for persecuted Christians.
- 4) Entrust one's daily work and activity to the protection of St. Joseph the Worker.
- 5) Follow St. Joseph's example in performing a corporal work of mercy.
- 6) Perform one of the spiritual works of mercy.
- 7) Pray the rosary together with one's family in order that "all Christian families may be stimulated to recreate the same atmosphere of intimate communion, love and prayer that was in the Holy Family."
- 8) Engaged couples can also receive an indulgence from praying the rosary together.
- 9) Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer, because St. Joseph "invites us to rediscover our filial relationship with the Father, to renew fidelity to prayer, to listen and correspond with profound discernment to God's will."
- 10) Pray an approved prayer to St. Joseph on St. Joseph Sunday, the Sunday after Christmas in the Byzantine Catholic tradition.
- 11) Pray an approved prayer to St. Joseph on the 19th of any month.
- 12) Honor Joseph with an act of piety or approved prayer on a Wednesday, the day traditionally dedicated to St. Joseph.
- 13) Celebrate the feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1 with an act of piety or prayer." The decree noted that in this instance the person must have the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions for an indulgence, as well as a detachment from sin. **"15 Ways to Gain an Indulgence in the Year of St. Joseph By Courtney Mares, borrowed with permission CNA"**





Happy Easter!

I hope and pray you are enjoying the Easter season, as we celebrate Christ’s Resurrection!

During the month of April, we find ourselves in “Sacrament season” at St. Adalbert Parish. At the Easter Vigil Liturgy, we welcomed three members of our parish family into full initiation into the Catholic Church.

During this month, we also celebrate our young people who are preparing to receive the Sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation. Thirteen members of our parish family are being Confirmed and twelve are receiving the Sacrament of First Eucharist.

Working with our young people throughout the year has been inspiring and a great gift. Seeing their growth in their faith has been incredible to witness. Personally, it reminds me of the joy and excitement that I experienced when I was their age and preparing to make the sacraments! Additionally, whenever I have walked out of a session with our young people and their families, I feel my “heart burning within me” as I recognize the Holy Spirit’s presence in each of them.

Has there ever been a time in your life when you have spoken with others about the faith and felt an internal fire burning within your heart? This burst of joy is the Holy Spirit working within us and around us. It can come from simple conversations with friends or listening to a moving homily during the Liturgy.

To experience this internal fire burning within us long term, what are we doing to keep the flame going? During this past year with COVID, our faith may have been shaken a bit. At the beginning of COVID, we were unable to attend public Liturgy due to the shutdown. Additionally, many activities and other gatherings have been limited or even canceled. Living in a world with limitations challenges us to look further regarding what we can do to fuel the internal fire burning within us and coming to better know and experience God. It takes practice at times, but when we find a particular way to fuel the internal fire (saying a devotion, reading the scriptures, having a faith sharing group...etc.) we feel that fire constantly burning within us.

As we continue to journey through the Easter season and celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus, it is important for us to reflect on what we can do to keep our internal fire burning and spread the light to others. When Bishop Perez was in our Diocese, he used to say the following to Confirmation candidates:

“Never, never, never ever underestimate the power of the Holy Spirit working in you, through you and despite you.”






