

## THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH INDULGENCE

allows one to gain the indulgence in one of several ways along with receiving the sacraments of Confession and Eucharist and saying an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be for the Holy Father. One of the ways is to celebrate the feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1 with an act of piety or prayer. The elderly, the sick, and the dying who are unable to leave their homes due to the coronavirus pandemic also have special permission to receive an indulgence by "offering with trust in God the pains and discomforts" of their lives with a prayer to St. Joseph, hope of the sick and patron of a happy death. The decree noted that in this instance the person must have the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions for an indulgence, as well as a detachment from sin. **Cont'd pg 7**



**FROM THE DESK OF DEACON EDMUND GARDIAS,**

This fourth week of the Easter season has John presenting us with the words of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. "A good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep."

The church holds each of us to a higher moral standard in the world that means sometimes we have to be more flexible than those around us. A good shepherd risks much for those he cares for, sometimes even to the extent of put his life on the line. This seems like we are being asked to go outside our comfort zone in dealing with people who may be unchristian in their behavior, unrealistic in their expectations and unrelenting in their demands in life. We all have people around us that challenge our Catholic faith, our beliefs and how we live in this world. I have to believe Jesus had disciples that challenged his teachings, frustrated him with their lack of understanding and made him roll his eyes with some of the words that came out of their mouth's.



So how do we get through times that challenge our faith and way of life?

Many years ago, I struggled with 'challenging' people in my life. My feelings toward others, both positive and negative, would sway my attitude and how I would respond to them. Do I really have to lay down my life for that person? Jesus really didn't mean that person, did he?


Some wisdom from the Holy Spirit helps us understand how we are called to respond during these difficult situations.

- \*We can't change other people and make them be who we want them to be, we can only be good examples of what Christ is calling us to become.
- \*The events of life don't cause problems, its how we respond to those events that cause the problem. Try not to view these events as being unfair or unjust as they pertain to your situation.
- \*Try to see life's events with a different perspective. Looking at someone or something the same way all the time, won't allow you to find solutions to the situation.
- \*We have all been blessed with many great things and great people to share life with. What would happen if those great things and great people were no longer part of your life?
- \*Put yourself in the other persons shoes, why did he (she) say or do that?
- \*Forcing people to see our perspective will not necessarily open their eyes. You have to open their hearts first.
- \*You can't force someone to love you, you can only try to be someone who can be loved.

In ancient times, the shepherd was one of the worst occupations a person could have. Being a shepherd is a tough job. That person is being asked to go beyond the reasonable, that person is asked to be extremely flexible and at times that person is asked to lay down his (her) life. This is what Christ is asking of us.

When dealing with others, we need to have the shepherds view of things, not what we want but what Jesus wants and how he wants us to respond.

I pray this Easter Season shapes your life to be more of a shepherd, creating a better world for everyone.




