



Brothers and Sisters,

As we come to this 6th Sunday of Easter, I find myself being reminded of the new life we find in Spring and ultimately in the Resurrection. At the Masses last week, I was also reminded of new life in the life of the Church as more and more people are coming back to Mass. Some had been away until last week when they felt comfortable enough to come back. It really brought joy to my heart to see the pews being filled again and to see faces that I hadn't seen in a long time. It was a sign of hope that things are moving in the right direction. 

First Holy Communion

FROM THE DESK OF JENNIFER BROEREN, DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

You may notice this weekend that we have returned to having a procession of the priest and ministers through the church while the Entrance Antiphon or hymn is sung! Besides getting the priest and ministers from the sacristy to the altar, what is the purpose of the entrance procession? In the early Church, after Christianity was legalized, the pope would process from one church to another church where the Mass would begin. This would help the people prepare themselves for Mass as the Kyrie and litanies would be sung as they processed. Over the years, this procession shortened to be just within the church. One of the aspects of the procession was a sense of *pilgrimage*.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states: "Pilgrimages evoke our earthly journey toward heaven and are traditionally very special occasions for renewal in prayer." (CCC 2691) The Mass is a very integral part of our journey on earth, which should remind us of what we ultimately hope for: Heaven. In our participation in the Mass, we enter into the Divine Liturgy of Heaven, which gives us inspiration and food for our journey.

Notice the similarities of the entrance procession to our Lord's entrance into Jerusalem just before his Passion. The priest enters the church and processes to a song of praise (sans donkey of course!). His steps are oriented toward the altar of sacrifice. He ascends the steps into the sanctuary to reach the altar, just as our Lord ascended Calvary to reach the place of His sacrifice. I hope some of these images may provide you with a greater appreciation and understanding of the entrance procession of the Mass!
