A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

FROM THE DESK OF FR. CHUCK BUTKOWSKI

Brothers and Sisters,



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. We celebrate Jesus ascending to the right hand of the Father and entering into His heavenly inheritance. We rejoice because, as Jesus had promised, when He goes to the Father He will then send the Holy Spirit (which we will celebrate next week on Pentecost). Often when we think of the Ascension, we tend to focus solely on Christ. Rightfully so, as this is the fulfillment and culmination of His mission here on Earth. However, this celebration is also a great day for us. I was reading an excerpt from Pope Leo the Great and I wanted to share with you a bit of his reflection,

“Our present rejoicing is on account of His Ascension into heaven. With all due solemnity we are commemorating that day on which our poor human nature was carried up, in Christ, above all the hosts of heaven, above all the ranks of angels, beyond the highest heavenly powers to the very throne of God the Father.”

This celebration reminds us of the hope of the resurrection of the body and to be where our brother, Jesus Christ, has already paved the way. This is a reminder of God’s plan and intention for all humanity because of His great love for us.

This great love is also seen in our readings for this week, I was particularly drawn to the first reading from Acts of the Apostles. Luke begins by explaining that this book is the continuation of where his Gospel left off; after the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus Christ. He references someone named Theophilus. As I reflected on this, something interesting stirred in my heart. While there very well may have been a single person that Luke is writing to, I thought about that name and looked up the Greek meaning. I was struck that the name means “Friend of God,” and “Beloved of God.” Seeing this, it brought up an idea that, as we are all God’s beloved sons and daughters, maybe Luke is writing to all of us. It made reading Acts of the Apostles a little more personal for me. Maybe in your own personal reflections, it may lead to more meaning for you.

My brothers and sisters as we go through this week may we be drawn more deeply in a relationship with the Father as we see His plan for us continue to unfold before us and let us rejoice in the coming of the Spirit, the great gift that the Father and Son send for our benefit.

This weekend, too, we celebrate the gift of the Priesthood as four men are ordained to the priesthood for the Diocese of Cleveland. May we rejoice with these men and pray for them as they enter into ministry for the service of the Church. In a special way, let us also rejoice for our own community here at St. Adalbert. Fr. Cameron Popik, son of our parish, has said “Yes.” to God’s call and he will enter his first assignment as a priest at St. Hillary in Fairlawn. May God Bless Fr. Cameron and his fellow ordinands!

Happy Easter! It is hard to believe that we are still in the Easter season, even though it is May. Flowers are in bloom, trees are budding, nature is starting to emerge from its winter hibernation and people are starting to go out more. There is finally a light at the end of the tunnel. However, there is still an uncertainty that hangs over our heads. Elijah the prophet felt overwhelmed too; so much so that he prayed he might die. However, after he took a nap and an angel brought him something to eat for his journey, he felt better. Again, Elijah became overwhelmed and went into hiding in a cave and the LORD appeared and reminded him that he wasn't alone; to go out and find those who are also followers of God. (1 Kings 19:4-18).



I wonder if that is how the disciples felt. Even after the Resurrection they seemed to be waiting for the other shoe to drop and feel abandoned again.
