

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR, FR. CHUCK BUTKOWSKI

Brothers and Sisters,

As we come to this Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we find ourselves transitioning from summer to fall. Many changes take place, the weather get cooler, the days get shorter, and the leaves begin to change colors and fall to the ground. I've always enjoyed the fall season. I like the crisp autumn air and the beauty that this season presents to us, and also football returns! As I reflected more about this season and the readings for this Sunday, I was struck by the whole idea of change.

Obviously, we know about the changes that take place in nature, but the Lord is showing us through His Word that we are also called to interior changes in our lives. In the first reading, the people of God are called to change their thoughts about Eldad and Medad and their preconceived notions about how God should grace his people with the outpouring of the Spirit. James is imploring the people to change their understanding of their lives and to live for God and not the ways of the world. Jesus in the Gospel is challenging His disciples to work with others and not confine God's gifts and the name of Jesus only to a select few. It reminds of the second reading from last week when James comments, "Where jealousy and selfish and ambition are found there will be discord and every foul practice." The interior change that we are being prompted to is to allow the Lord to be our guide, to allow Him to lead us. This can be very difficult and it requires us to die to our own wants and desires. For this we can look to nature, the creation God has given to us. The trees must shed their leaves and appear to die that new life might spring forth. This is the desire that God has for each and every one of us. He wants to give us new life, but for that to happen we have to die to our former ways. My brothers and sisters, as we enter this week and the season of fall, may we be mindful and reflect on what we need to die to in order that God might bring about new life in our lives.
