

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR, FR. CHUCK BUTKOWSKI

Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend we celebrate the Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. As we approach the end of our liturgical year and prepare to begin a new year on the First Sunday of Advent, we are reminded in our readings of what our faith truly means. We tend to look at our faith as merely an act of belief, but our readings show us that true faith is much more. Faith not only is belief, but in that belief there is an offering of self. Looking at the Gospel passage we see the scribes wanting to take from others and promote themselves to high positions; whereas the widow gives all she has as an offering to God. She does not hold anything back for herself but offers a complete gift of whole self. In the same way, in the first reading, we see the widow of Zarephath offer her very last bit of food and drink to the Lord's prophet Elijah; in an act of faith, not knowing what will become of her and her son. The second reading reminds us of the example of faith that Christ gives us by offering His own body and blood for our sake.

Each of these instances of faith reminds us of the life to which we are called. It begs us to ask ourselves the question, "Do I give or do I take?" Are we only trying to the good of which God offers for ourselves, or do we have the faith to offer ourselves completely to God? This offering of self is not always easy but it can become easier the more that we know the Lord and walk with Him. This is why prayer is so vital to our spiritual lives, if we don't know God, we can be reluctant to offer completely to Him, but the more that we get to know Him the more willing we are to trust and to give away. My brothers and sisters, as we come to the end of this Liturgical Year may we reflect on the past year to look at our faith life. Are there areas that I need to improve? What did I do well? Do I know more about God and myself? And what can I do this coming year to help grow my relationship with the Lord?



On **Saturday November 20th**, our parish will host a Men's day of Reflection for all men, age 18 and older.



PARISH HAPPENINGS



November, a season of thanksgiving. Let us be thankful for all God has given us and let us share our blessings with those around us. Here are a few questions I've received from parishioners:

A parishioner asked, "Is St. Adalbert Cemetery full?"

I know many parishioners believe our cemetery is full because it is so old, but it is not. We have many plots still available, both single and double. A single plot costs \$1,380 and a double plot is \$2,740. This is a discounted price for St. Adalbert parishioners. We also have space in our new columbarium which offers a resting place for those who wish to be cremated. We have 68 niches available and they range in price from \$1,300 to \$1,500. Make an appointment with Darlene to learn about all the details.

A parishioner asked, "Who are all the people in the Sanctuary ceiling painting?"

Good question! There are probably many parishioners who wonder the same thing!

Let's start with the middle. In the middle there is God the Father holding Jesus, and the Holy Spirit is a dove above Jesus' head. The depiction surrounding the Holy Trinity, an ox, a lion, an angel, and a bird, are representative of the four evangelists. The Latin wording on the scrolls mean, Christ Conquers, Christ Reigns, and Christ Commands.



Now to the left there is a grouping of four individuals.

Peter is in the front holding keys, Moses is in the front next to Peter, holding the stone tablets. Behind them is St. Dominic and St. Benedict.

To the right of these individuals, is Mary and Joseph kneeling.

To the right of the Holy Trinity is Moses holding the staff and pointing. To the right of Moses, we

have another grouping of four. Here is Paul in the front in red. Next to Paul is an undetermined individual thought to be an apostle. Behind Paul is King David and St. Francis.

The lettering "IHS" signifies the Greek first three letters of Jesus' name.




Another good question, "Is there going to be another free Thanksgiving Dinner this year at St. Adalbert?"
