





FROM THE DESK OF DEACON ED GARDIAS

How is God talking to me?

Last weekend at the 10:00 Mass, we celebrated the Rite of Welcome and the Rite of Acceptance for the adults that are journeying through the RCIA process. This year we have five adults who are exploring the deep meaning of the Catholic faith and the possibility that they might be received into the Catholic Church at the 2022 Easter Vigil. The rite calls for the priest to pray over the candidates, while their sponsors make the sign of the cross over their eyes, ears, shoulders, heart, and hands. This powerful blessing helps those in the process, know the power of our Lord in their lives and reinforces their desire to know more.



The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults provides catechesis about the faith, searches the soul of the inquirer, and provides guidance for the persons spirituality. Each year thousands of adults explore this process that culminates at the Easter Vigil, resulting in the continued growth of our church.

Searching our spiritual lives for how God is talking to me, requires a few demands upon our lives or changes that we must make to discern His will.

The first requirement is to resist the temptation to ignore His voice. God continues to speak to us each day in ways we don't always recognize. Is the voice drawing closer to the heavenly kingdom or does it tell you you're wasting your time?

Secondly, we must establish self-discipline in our prayer lives. Just as we communicate with our family and friends, we must also establish a good line of communication with God, he wants to hear your voice!

Thirdly, establish good habits. Plato once wrote "the first and greatest victory is to conquer yourself." Having good habits helps you trust in your daily decision making, knowing that you are doing the will of God.

Fourth, we must recognize that we need God, He does not need us. Through the struggles of life, the Creator is ever present, willing to help us if we humble ourselves and have faith in the plan that he has for us.

Adults that have traversed the RCIA process over the years have commented, after they were received in the church, that they have experienced something that is indescribable. The voice of God speaking to them as they continue their spiritual journey.

I ask that you keep in your prayers, those five men and women (whose pictures and names can be found in the connecting lobby). These RCIA candidates, with the grace of God, will one day experience the great joy of the Sacraments and enter into full communion with the Catholic Church.
