Lots of News...

Donut Sundays – We're bringing back coffee and donuts... beginning Sunday, August 7 after both 8am and 10:30am Mass! Until we bolster our volunteer crew back to pre-COVID levels, we will have "Donut Sundays" only on the first Sunday of every month. Beyond this, and somewhat ironic as I've joked before, we are also bringing back our Health and Wellness Committee's sponsored Blood Pressure Checks. These, too, will be the first Sunday of the month and take place during Coffee and Donuts, but also after 4:30pm Mass on Saturday that weekend. If you're interested in volunteering to help with Donut Sundays, please give the Parish Office a call or send us an email using office@sjohio.org and we will get you in touch with our coordinator.

Eucharistic Reflections – As you heard on Corpus Christi Sunday, we are in the midst of a National Eucharistic Revival continuing until Pentecost 2025. As a community that hosts a Perpetual Eucharistic Chapel, we are uniquely posed to reflect upon the centrality of the Eucharist in our spiritual lives. We know, from our 2021 survey, that "73% of our respondents strongly believe that the Eucharist is really the body and blood of Jesus Christ"! Over the course of the next three years, I intend weekly to share a quote here from the Church's many documents relating to the Eucharist as an aid for us in our continued reflection on this great gift!

Funeral Lunches – Speaking of bringing back programs and ministries, we are in the midst of working with both returning and new folks in helping to coordinate funeral lunches. We anticipate being able to bring these back, too! As with Donut Sundays, if you would like to lend hand with these, please give the Parish Office a call or send us an email using office@sjohio.org. We'll get you connected to one of the coordinators.

New Weekend Mass Schedule – We are settling into our second weekend. Even though it was a holiday weekend, we appear to have transitioned nicely into it as attendance was slightly better than Memorial Day Weekend. Some may have missed our changes, so I encourage you to continue to share the changes. The remainder of the Diocese will be soon undertaking a process to look at Mass schedules - so I'm glad that we're ahead of the curve! I believe that a more-full church will yield a better liturgical prayer experience. Having one less Mass, both Fr. Kevin and I, are available to help other parishes when priests are sick or traveling, so we may not be around as much as you are accustomed to after or before Masses. Interesting to note, the Diocese recently shared that we have 421 priests in the Diocese. 216 are Diocesan priests (only 24 of those are like Fr. Kevin as parochial vicars) serving our 185 parishes. We have 99 retired priests, 75 religious order priests, 16 priests from other dioceses ministering here, and 15 on leave. We ordained 3 priests this year and are slated to ordain 6 in 2023.

May the Eucharist that we receive today continue to nourish us,





SACRED MUSIC NOTES BY LUKE MASSERY

The US Bishops have declared a time of Eucharistic Revival for the church in America. As a way to strengthen our belief in the real presence of Christ, I propose this musical idea: Over the summer months of Ordinary Time, there are a few communion antiphons included in the liturgy that are drawn from overtly Eucharistic scripture passages. On these days, I believe chanting this communion antiphon together during the communion procession can deepen our faith in the Eu-When words are delivered through music, they seem to penetrate our soul and remain in our memory. And when they are chanted, the music elevates and serves the text without altering it or imposing a rhythm upon it. This is the genius of Gregorian chant: The freedom of the rhythm and natural contour of the melody create an atmosphere of space and stillness. It floats in the air like musical incense rising. It is like a musical form of "Lectio Divina," the practice of meditating on short passages of scripture. We sing the word of God while we receive the Word of God in communion. This Sunday's communion antiphon is:
