FROM OUR ADMINISTRATOR



Praise the Lord! Alleluia! Brothers and sisters in Christ, our Scripture readings for the **Sixth Sunday of Easter** highlight the central call of the Gospel. Jesus told His disciples on the night of the Last Supper, *“This is my commandment: love one another as I love you.”* This command gets to **the heart of what Jesus came to bring us.** He came so that we might know and be transformed by the love of God, and from that, love others with the love of God. St. John, in his first letter, writes, *“Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God.”* **What does it mean to love others as God loves us?** In our culture today, you’ll find lots of explanations of “love”. Most often, you’ll hear “love” described in a way that’s tied strictly to emotional highs and intense attraction to another person. With that understanding of “love”, if the feelings change or the attraction goes away, then so does the love. But our Catholic tradition gives us a different understanding of love. **To love someone is to will the good of another.** This is what God does for us; God chooses to will what’s best for us at all times. So, for us to follow Jesus’s commandment and *“love one another as I love you,”* we must seek to will the good of others, despite what our emotions or level of attraction might be. Giving this kind of love is only possible once we’ve received the love of God into our hearts, trusting that God has freely chosen to love us out of His own goodness.

Parish listening sessions are coming in June! Shortly after arriving in January, I wanted a chance for us to gather as a parish and talk about who we are and where we’re going. We will have three opportunities to gather as a parish community to prayerfully discuss our history as St. Joseph’s Parish, as well as our hopes for the future. **We will call these sessions, “History & Hopes”.** Each session will include snacks and time for small-group table discussion and large-group sharing as well. **The three “History & Hopes” events will be the same event each time.** There are just three different opportunities for you to attend based on your availability in the summer. The dates will be **Tuesday, June 11th @ 6:30-8:30pm, Wednesday, June 19th @ 6:30-8:30pm, and Sunday, June 23rd @ 3-5pm.** Please mark your calendars now to attend one of these sessions! Your input is very important! More details will be coming in the weeks ahead.

Calling all Eucharistic Adorers! Do you frequent our Perpetual Adoration Chapel on a regular basis? Did you know that we’re desperately in need of committed Eucharistic Adorers to be with Jesus throughout the day and night? Having Perpetual Adoration at our parish is a wonderful blessing, and it’s a big responsibility for all of us as we strive to have at least two people in Adoration when the Eucharist is exposed. In the coming weeks, please keep an eye out near the sign-in book in the chapel. There will be a schedule posted of what hours of the day/night that we need people to be with Jesus. **If you’re able to commit yourself to a regular day and time for Adoration, check the schedule and please sign up.** And if you’re already a committed Adorer or a regular Adorer, reach out to a family member or friend who might be willing to join you and invite them to Eucharistic Adoration. Personal invitations are the most effective in bringing people to Jesus! **And time with Jesus will change a person’s life!**

The Viking Voice

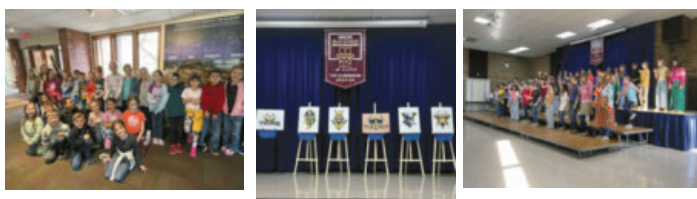
