#### FROM OUR PASTOR



Praise the Lord! Brothers and sisters in Christ, we have come to the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Yes, this weekend includes Super Bowl Sunday, too. But we want to make sure we tune into Jesus before tuning into the game! In our Gospel for Sunday, we hear Jesus tell Simon Peter,

"Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon does what Jesus tells him to do but not without a little disbelief. After the nets were lowered, Simon caught so many fish that the nets were tearing! Seeing this astonishing catch of fish, Simon fell at the feet of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Have you ever thought Simon's response was strange? Why did he fall at Jesus's feet and confess his sins? For Simon, it seems that this catch of fish was more than a lucky break after a slow night at sea. Something about this moment was a revelation to Simon Peter about who Jesus was. And when he realized he was in the presence of the Holy One, Simon was overcome with his own sinfulness and unworthiness. Now, notice Jesus's response to Simon when he confesses his sinfulness. Jesus doesn't say, "Oh no, Simon! Don't talk like that! You're just fine." And Jesus doesn't say, "Yes, Simon, you're a horrible sinner, and depart from my presence!" Instead, Jesus says, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." Jesus doesn't disagree with Simon, and neither does He condemn Simon. Jesus focuses Simon's attention on moving forward together with Him. You see, as humans, we tend to do one of two things when we come face to face with our own sin. We either (1) downplay it and tell ourselves we're fine, or (2) we just allow our sin to crush us. But Jesus wants us to humbly face our sinfulness and then hear Him say, "Do not be afraid". He doesn't want us to get stuck in our sin and struggles, but He wants us to focus on moving forward with courage and conversion, trusting that He will be with us every step of the way. May we hear Jesus speak to us this week in our struggles, "Do not be afraid", and may we focus on courageously moving forward, trusting in His grace.

Eucharistic Consecration coming soon! We're continuing our parish spiritual pilgrimage through the book "33 Days to Eucharistic Glory", and we're almost to Day 33! On the weekend of February 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>, we will have spiritually prepared ourselves, and we'll make our act of consecration to the Eucharist at all the Masses. What will this act of consecration be? At all the Masses that weekend, we will take a moment at the end of the petitions to pray a particular prayer together, offering ourselves to Jesus in the Eucharist, surrendering ourselves to Him, and asking Him to transform us entirely by His life and His love. At the end of the book, there is a prayer of consecration. We will pray a form of this prayer together, and we'll have cards available for you to read at Mass (you won't have to memorize this prayer!). You might be wondering, "What if I didn't finish the book? Can I still do the consecration prayer?" Yes! While we've taken this time as a parish to ready our hearts for consecration to the Eucharist, your preparation doesn't need to take exactly 33 days. If you want to give your life more to Jesus in the Eucharist and you want Him to have greater control in your life, then you can make this act of consecration! Furthermore, this consecration doesn't have to be a "one and done" occasion. You can consecrate (and reconsecrate) yourself to the Eucharist more than once. May the love of Jesus in the Eucharist flood our hearts that we may become the saints God made us to be.

Catholic Charities in-pew appeal February 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup>. While most parishes in the Diocese will be doing the 2025 Catholic Charities in-pew appeal next weekend, we'll be moving the appeal to the following weekend of February 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. Given that we're doing the consecration to the Eucharist next weekend, I thought it would be best to move the in-pew appeal accordingly. So be on the lookout for more information on this year's Catholic Charities in a couple of weeks!

"E.A.T. Your Way to Heaven" Lenten Series! I'm so excited to announce that in March, we'll be having a Lenten mission series! We will host a 3-night series on the Eucharist, and it'll be called, "E.A.T Your Way to Heaven: Encounter Jesus. Abide with Him. Transform the world." This 3-part presentation will be given by popular Catholic speaker and podcaster, Michael Gormley. Michael Gormley is the host of the Ascension Press podcast, "Every Knee Shall Bow", and he has spoken all over the country at missions and conferences, including Steubenville Youth Conferences. Mark your calendars now for the evenings of March 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup>, and 26<sup>th</sup>! You will not want to miss this 3-night Lenten series on the power of the Eucharist!


#### THE HEARING LOOP






#### The Importance of Music at Mass

The importance of music in Biblical religion is shown very simply by the fact that the verb "to sing" (with related words such as "song" and so forth) is one of the most commonly used words in the Bible. It occurs 309 times in the Old Testament and 36 in the New. When man comes into contact with God, mere speech is not enough. (The Spirit of the Liturgy, (SF, CA: Ignatius, 2000), p. 136) Pope Benedict XVI

#### **Memorial Acclamation**

You may have noticed that we keep repeating the same Memorial Acclamation on Sunday, even while the rest of the Ordinary of the Mass (Gloria, Holy, Amen, Lamb of God) changes seasonally. By singing the same "we proclaim" each week, I have noticed that participation is getting better and better. We always sing it a capella, starting on the same pitch the priest ends on with his "the mystery of faith" chant. At this high point of the Mass, right after the consecration of the Eucharist, I felt that consistency and repetition is better than variety. It seems to be working. We will change it at some point, probably at Easter. Here is the memorial acclamation chant:


