FROM OUR PASTOR



Praise the Lord! Brothers and sisters in Christ, here we are at the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. We've also come to the weekend where we'll be consecrating ourselves as a parish to the Eucharist. When we set out on this 33-day spiritu-

al pilgrimage to greater devotion to the Eucharist, I didn't intentionally choose this weekend for the consecration based on the Scripture readings for Mass. But the readings line up perfectly! In the passage from Jeremiah, we hear God speaking through the prophet and telling us, "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh... Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose hope is in the LORD." The Responsorial Psalm echoes this call to trust in God above all. St. Paul writing to the Corinthians highlights the power that comes from a faith rooted in Christ raised from the dead. And Jesus gives His "Sermon on the Plain" where He describes the true "blessedness" or joy that comes from being His disciple. It's a joy that fills our hearts when we live our lives with utter faith and trust in God, no matter what comes our way. Brothers and sisters, this is what consecrating ourselves to the Eucharist is all about! It's about putting all our trust in God each day and not in ourselves or things of the world. It's about being rooted in the resurrected life of Jesus that is given to us in the Eucharist. And it's about living with a faith that God is with us in all things and having the courage to surrender everything to Him. Whether you've been preparing for 33 days, or you simply want more of what Jesus wants to give you in the Eucharist, by consecrating your life to His Presence in the Eucharist, you're committing yourself to following Jesus wholeheartedly, trusting that He will provide for you in all things. Let us ready our hearts to be consecrated to the Eucharist!

Prayer of Consecration to the Eucharist. The following prayer is adapted from the Prayer of Eucharistic Consecration in the book, "33 Days to Eucharistic Glory":

Lord Jesus Christ, Bread of Life, True God and True Man, the Alpha and the Omega, truly present – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – in the Blessed Sacrament, I consecrate myself to You today without reservation.

Here I am, Lord. I come to do Your will. Come and dwell within me. Heal my body, focus my mind, transform my heart, and nourish my soul so that I may represent You faithfully in the many situations and circumstances of my daily life.

I surrender completely and absolutely to Your goodness. I place all that I am and all that I have at Your feet. Take what You want to take and give what You want to give. Transform me. Transform my life. I trust in the eternal genius of Your ways. Lead me, encourage me, challenge me. Show me how I can collaborate with You, and I will do what You ask with a joyful heart. Grant me the grace, wisdom, and courage to live justly, love tenderly, and humbly walk with You, my God, all the days of my life.

Angels and Saints, lead me in the ways of the pilgrim on earth, so that one day I too may share in Heaven.

Mary, Mother of Jesus, teach my soul how to receive your Son in the Eucharist, and how to represent Him in this world. Intercede for me and obtain the grace necessary so that by receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, my heart may become ever more like His Eucharistic Heart. Amen.



Square Notes

If you look at today's (Sunday's) communion antiphon, you will notice that the music appears different than the music in the left column. This is a different system of notation that predates modern notation and is also called "chant notation." This system is obviously very similar to modern notation, with a few main differences. The notes are square, there are only 4 lines instead of 5, some notes are stacked on top of each other, some are in groups of 3, there are vertical lines that indicate where to breathe, there are no stems on the notes. For the musicians, there are no treble or bass clefs, just C and F clefs, which can be moved anywhere that is comfortable in the voice. The asterisk * indicates where the people come in on the first time through.

Why use this system? Well, some benefits are that it is easier for the eyes to group the notes according to the words. Take a look at the word "ate" and "not" in the chant. See how the notes for those words are grouped together above the word? When stacked, we sing the bottom one first. This visual grouping helps us to proclaim chant more like sung speech. The vertical lines instruct us where to breathe. The Men's Chant choir has been studying this system, as many of the Church's chants are written this way. As you follow along and sing today's antiphon, I'm sure you will get the hang of it.


