#### Submission as Stewardship.

We aren't comfortable with the idea of submission. Our society champions equality, and rightly so — but it's a mistake to think that submission is at odds with equality. To submit ourselves fully, we must first be free. We must first be our own masters. God has granted us that freedom with the salvation He offers. We are no longer the slaves of sin. Now He asks us to be subordinate to one another, in the name of Christ.

What a completely uncomfortable task! What He's asking is for us to be subordinate to the person who irritates us the most. The person we really can't stand. The person who doesn't respect us or appreciate what we have to offer. The person we think we're smarter than, more talented than. The person we envy.

That's the real challenge of stewardship, isn't it? Subordination. Inconveniencing myself by giving of time, of money, of relationship. Putting the needs or wants of another above my own when they haven't done anything special to earn it.

I invite you to consider the cross — the most radical expression of submission, and of stewardship, that ever existed. If there was ever someone who deserved superiority, isn't it the God who let Himself be nailed to a tree, who gave so freely of His life, His body, His blood, His everything?

To look at him in his agony is to truly understand the beauty of submission — of laying down what you have for the good of the other.

### *CLUSTER NEWS*

#### Jubilee 2025

The Psalms, 'the prayer of Jesus,' Are for all seasons When we recite the Psalms, the Holy Father explained, "God listens to them with that grandiose "orchestration" that is the community of saints". He recalled that Jesus, according to the Letter to the Hebrews, entered into the world with a verse from a Psalm in His heart: 'Lo, I have come to do thy will, O God'(cf.Heb 10:7, Ps 40:9), and He left the world, according to the Gospel of Luke, with another verse on His lips: 'Father, into thy hands I commit my spirit' (Lk 23:46, cf.Ps31:6). The use of the psalms in the New Testament, he added, is certainly followed by that of the Fathers and the entire Church, but has an important role in our world today. "We cannot only live on the legacy of the past," he argued, by saying, "it is necessary to make the Psalms our prayer. It was written that, in a certain sense, we must ourselves become the 'scribes' of the Psalms, making them ours and praying with them. When Psalms, or verses, "speak to our

heart", he said, "it is good to repeat them and pray them during the day." Since they are prayers, "for all seasons," he said, "there is no state of mind or need that does not find in them the best words to be transformed into prayer." Unlike other prayers, the Pope stated, they do not lose their effectiveness by being repeated, but, "on the contrary, they increase it." This is so, he said, because "they are inspired by God and 'breather' God every time they are read with faith. The Pope insisted that if we feel oppressed or fearful, or loving and joyful, there is a Psalm that can accompany us, and enrich our prayer by not reducing it merely to requests. They help us, he said, to open ourselves to a prayer that is less focused on ourselves, and rather on praise, blessing and thanksgiving. The Pope concluded by praying that the Holy Spirit "make this year of preparation for the Jubilee a symphony of prayer.


