MINISTRY TO THE SICK


In case of illness or hospitalization please contact the office so arrangements can be made to receive the Holy Eucharist, and Anointing of the Sick if necessary.

Take Up Your Cross

When I'm interviewing people for my job as a staff writer at an archdiocesan newspaper, I like to ask them this question: at the end of your life, when you meet God, what do you want to hear Him say?

I've gotten a lot of interesting answers.

"I called and you listened."

"What tee time would you like tomorrow?"

"What were you thinking?"

"Your service made things better."

It's a question I've thought a lot about, personally. What I want to hear God say when I finally see His face is this: "You can put it down now."

When Jesus asks his disciples "Who do you say that I am?" he is not just asking them to verbalize an answer. He is asking them to do something: pick up the cross. Find the problems in this world, in this life, and throw your arms around them. Drag them to God, even if it kills you. It's not enough to stand by the sidelines, watching Christ ascend to Calvary, nodding your head in approval. Yes, I agree. Yes, I believe. Yes, Jesus, good job! You have to follow in every bloody footprint he leaves in the dust. Set your face like flint. And when you meet him at the top, you better not be empty-handed. He has a cross, he will expect you to have one, too.

I hope that I can do it. I hope that I am strong enough. I am not one of those great, hardy souls. I stumble terribly under the weight of my very small cross. I grumble as I shift it from shoulder to shoulder. But every time I have been almost at the point of giving up, almost ready to lay it down, there is something — Someone — who supports my drooping arm. The Lord God is my help.

If, at the end of everything, I hear the words, "You can put it down now," then I will know I have made it. I will know I have not failed.



The Psalms, 'the prayer of Jesus,' Are for all seasons The following is taken from a book by Thomas Merton, Praying the Psalms: When we praise God, says St. Augustine, there must be order n our praise. It must be intelligent, spiritual. We mu should we on the other hand be so 'objective' that there is no longer anything personal in our prayer to God. In order that we may remain on the straight road, turning neither to the right nor to the left, "the best way is to seek the way of praise in the Scriptures of God. "(Melius iter laudis in Scripturea Dei Quaerimus) St. Augustine adds that God has taught us to praise Him, in the Psalms, not in order that He may get something out of this praise, but in order that we may be made better by it. Praising God in the words of the Psalms, we come to know Him better. Knowing Him better we love Him better, loving Him better we find our happiness in Him. "Therefore, because He knew that this would be for our benefit, He made Himself more lovable to us by praising Himself." These words, take from St. Augustine's commentary on Psalm 144, are supplemented by others in his De Doctrina Christiana, where he says: "God wants to be loved not in order that He may get something out of it, but in order that those who love Him may receive

an eternal reward. And this reward is God

Himself, whom they love." (De Doct. Christ, 1:29)


