MINISTRY TO THE SICK


In case of illness or hospitalization please contact the office so arrangements can be made to receive the Holy Eucharist, and Anointing of the Sick if necessary.

The Hardness of Your Hearts

As far as I know, no one has ever woken up in the morning, looked out the window, and thought, "This is a beautiful sunrise. I'll have to be very careful not to let it make me happy."

But I'm certain that every day, lots of people — including, on not-infrequent occasions, myself — have woken up and remembered something that happened the day before. Something that made us feel upset or frustrated or insulted. And we thought to ourselves, "That makes me so, so angry." And we've pictured the face of the person who made us feel that way, and we have scoffed with disgust.

And we hold onto that anger because anger feels so much better than sadness. And deep within ourselves, in the place where we feel all the love and pain and confusion that is inherent in human existence, we harden.

Nobody ever intends to be hard-hearted. That's just the stuff of Bond villains and horror flicks. No, in real life a hardened heart isn't a conscious choice. It's a reflex. It's just us trying to protect ourselves, to be strong — or, at least, to embody the version of strength offered by a fallen world.

A heart of stone is not so easily scratched, you see. But it's also not so easily warmed or touched or moved.

A heart hardened by resentment and pain and anger is not just protected from injury. It is protected from the impact of the whole spectrum of tender feelings. It is not open to forgiveness, so it cannot feel the rush of life-giving mercy. It is closed off to new ideas, so it can never feel the awe of discovery.

There is a reason we are called to guard ourselves against hard-heartedness. God gave us hearts of flesh and blood. They are hearts that can be broken, yes — but also, they are hearts that can love and heal.

From the Notes on Prayer by Pope Francis
In Mark's gospel, we read that Jesus "Went out
to a deserted place, and there he prayed" (Mk
1:35). The Evangelist gives us an image of Jesus
that points to two essential dimensions of
Christian prayer: removing oneself from the
daily routine - necessary for seeking personal
dialogue with the Father - and a silent heart –
indispensable for listening for God's voice and
hearing what He wants. In this perspective and
in the context of the Year of Prayer, a spiritual
retreat can provide an unparalleled opportunity
for spiritual conversion and a renewal of heart to
which we have all been invited by the Holy
Father.

"Where two or three are gathered in my name" (Mt 18:20): the meaning of spiritual retreat

Jesus taught us that when Christians come together in prayer, He is in their midst in a special way. In this respect participating in a spiritual retreat is a great opportunity to experience the Lord's presence more fully through common life and prayer shared during retreat days. A spiritual retreat is not an escape from reality, but rather a fuller immersion into reality through the silence of prayer. The fruit of an authentic spiritual retreat will not be a yearning for days off from ordinary routines, but rather a new light transforming everyday life by the presence of the Lord. In a world that often distracts us and pulls us away from our life of faith, prayer retreat is like stopping at an oasis in a desert, in our cities, although full of ways and opportunities for encounter, often shroud or hide from view the true source of hope, the fount of joy that only the Lord can give us.
