



# Fr. Ron's Corner

Our belief in the Real Presences of Christ in the Eucharist is one of the most distinguishing teachings of the Catholic Church. We as Catholics are blessed that we have Eucharistic Liturgy (the Mass) where we believe and celebrate that Christ is REALLY present in His Word and the Eucharist, His Body and Blood. We read from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians: "Brothers and sisters: I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes." 1 Cor 11:23-26

The belief in the "Real Presences" first originates from our Jewish Ancestors, the celebration of Passover (Exodus 23:15). When celebrating



Passover, our ancient ancestors believed that God had not just saved them in the past, but that God was saving them right now, in this very moment. Since Jesus became the Sacrificial Lamb of the New Covenant, it was easy for the early Christian Church emerging out of Judaism to believe the God was saving them right now, in the new paschal lamb: JESUS! In a similar way, that Jesus is present in the Eucharist, reposed in the tabernacle, has its roots also in the book of Exodus 39:32-40:38.

Keeping holy the sabbath day by celebrating Mass and the devotional practice of "adoring" Jesus, present in the Eucharist outside of Mass, allows us to appreciate God's living presence among us in Jesus Christ, raised from the dead. This mystical presence, which we celebrate with profound devotion is the reason for our feast day today. Please join us for the Eucharistic Procession after the 11:00 am Mass today.

I am grateful for those who gave witness to the power of adoration in their devotional lives at Mass this weekend and for all those who have committed to the weekly (Tuesday) or monthly (First Friday) practice of Adoration. We invite you to consider the importance of Sunday Eucharist and the practice of adoration in the months ahead.

Vacation Bible school is the final event for this school and fiscal year. I want to thank everyone who made Vacation Bible School possible. Under the leadership of Rozann Swanson, our Director of Faith Formation, participants, student helpers and adult leaders all grew in their relationship with Jesus through Scripture, Song, Crafts, and other formative activities.

Planning for the fall is well underway and I am excited about our upcoming Parish Festival, Picnic and, new this September, we are hosting fall and back to school outdoor gatherings which we are calling "Northern Lights." Corpus Christi is a doctrinal feast established for three purposes: 1) to give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist and to honor Him there; 2) to instruct the people in the Mystery, Faith and devotion surrounding the Eucharist, and 3) to teach us to appreciate and make use of the great gift of the Holy Eucharist, both as a Sacrament and as a sacrifice.

A Voter Registration will be held after Masses on Saturday June 25 & Sunday June 26. All Ohioans must be registered to Vote by Monday July 4 to vote in Ohio's Primary Election on August 2. The August 2nd's ballot voters will be selecting the candidates for State Central Committee Member (Man), State Central Committee Member (Woman), State Senator for District 13, and State Representative for District 53. Nearly one of every two Christians who are eligible to vote do not take advantage of this opportunity. The August 2nd Primary election you can cast your ballot for candidates from your local area.
