
Fr. Ron's Corner

In the Gospel this weekend we hear: "Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." He replied to him, "Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?" Then he said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." Luke 12:13

"One's life does not consist of possessions" – these words of instruction from Jesus are very helpful to us. If our life does not consist of possessions then what does it consist of? The short answer is that our life should consist of RELATIONSHIPS with God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) and our neighbor. Jesus and many of the saints remind us that possessions in themselves are no bad, in fact they are necessary for us to live, but we are called to not be distracted by them. If obtaining and managing our possessions become the focus of all of time and attention, then we are like the foolish person "who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God." Luke 12:21. As I have said repeatedly, we need to take time everyday to pray, to invite God to be the center of our live. St. Francis de Sales famously said: "One should pray for a half hour every day, unless one is busy, then it should be an hour."

You will notice in the upcoming weeks that the Social Justice Article will be focused on: "Creating a Culture of Life." The expression "culture of life" entered popular parlance from Pope John Paul II in the 1990's. He used the term in his 1991 encyclical *Centesimus annus*, and then more fully expanded upon it in the 1995 encyclical Evangelium vitae ("Gospel of Life"): In our present social context, marked by a dramatic struggle between the "culture of life" and the "culture of death", there is need to develop a deep critical sense, capable of discerning true values and authentic needs. In the encyclical, the pope noted that even those who were not Catholic "can appreciate the intrinsic value of human life. "He also issued "a pressing appeal addressed to each and every person, in the name of God: Respect, protect, love, and serve life, every human life! Only in this direction will you find justice, development, true freedom, peace and happiness!"

John Paul linked this to Catholic teaching, which believes every person is created in the image and likeness of God and is intimately loved by God.[38][39] The Church, then, must build a culture of life that values each person as a person, not for what they own, do, or produce. It must also protect every human life, especially those that are threatened or weak. The doctrine had foundations in earlier church teaching such as Pope Paul VI's 1968 encyclical Humanae



vitae,[42] which articulated the Church's position defending life from conception to natural death, disapproving medical procedures harming an unborn fetus, which the Church holds to be a person with an inviolable right to life.

My hope is that we can begin to develop practical ways that we can support and encourage women who might be filled with fear over an unplanned pregnancy. How might our efforts encourage adoptions, foster care and other services that support life in all of its stages from conception until natural death. We will also investigate ministries that already exist in Lorain County and within the counties of the Diocese of Cleveland. As many have already said, that the reversal of Roe -v- Wade is not the end but a new beginning. As we help all those in need, in Jesus' name – we are storing up treasure in heaven.

May you know God's blessings each and every day and how much I love being your pastor.

Join The Flame of Love Prayer Circle!

What is it? It is Jesus Himself. It is a Devotion of Grace and Mary's Plan for Evangelization. What does devotion to the Flame of Love do? The effect of this devotion will make parishes, families, and the lives so full of Jesus by the power of grace, that Satan's influence on our families and communities is broken. Once freed from the blinding influence of Satan, our families and communities are much more open to the gospel and the way of salvation.

Where did it come from? Though many saints from Augustine to John of the Cross refer to the Flame of Love, the devotion is relatively new. In the early 1960's in Communist Hungary, Jesus and Mary introduced this devotion to a widowed mother of six and a Secular Carmelite named Elizabeth Kidelmann.

Is it Church approved? Yes. The local ordinary, His Eminence Cardinal Peter Erdo, Primate of Hungary, established the Flame of Love Movement as a Private Association of the Faithful with Juridic Personality. The last phrase is important. Private Associations are not necessarily approved but any Association with Juridic Personality must be approved by competent ecclesiastical authority. So though the Movement was established in Budapest, the approval is for the Universal Church.




