

SCRIPTURE TRANSLATIONS

Part Two: Is This a Catholic Bible?

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Faith,

Last week, I wrote to you about scripture translations in general, and how the Church considers the original Hebrew or Greek texts to be the basis of all translations. This week, we turn our attention to a question that people often ask: "Is this a Catholic Bible?"

There are a few ways in which one might answer that. That's not a bad question, but sometimes it's tough to give a simple "yes" or "no" answer. There are three areas that pertain to whether or not we might refer to a particular scripture translation as "Catholic": ecclesiastical approval, scholarship, and whether or not a particular bible contains all the books that should be there. Let's look at these one by one.

First of all, there is the question of whether a particular translation has ecclesiastical approval. That shouldn't be too tough to figure out. If one turns the "Copyright Page"—the page after the "Title Page"—that's where one can usually find an "imprematur," if there is one. That means that a bishop has given his okay that the book doesn't contain anything that might be contrary to the faith. It tends to be fairly easy to spot. Look for the Latin word "imprematur," which is usually preceded by a cross and followed by the name of the bishop who granted the imprimatur and the year in which he granted it. An imprematur is something like a Catholic counterpart to the "Good Housekeeping Seal of Approval." If you see that, you can be sure that it qualifies as a "Catholic Bible." Of course, if one is purchasing a book online, it's not always possible to look for the this designation.

Second, there's the question of scholarship. In our present age, translations of the Bible are usually accomplished by a group of scholars rather than a single human being. Scripture scholars come from divergent Christian (and, in the case of the Old Testament, even non-Christian) traditions. Some translations are the product of scholarship that is exclusively Catholic, some have no input from Catholics at all, and some are the work of a mixed group of scholars comprised of both Catholics and non-Catholics. This is not to say that translations done exclusively under Catholic scholarship are necessarily better or more accurate or more orthodox than others. That said, it is not outside the realm of possibility that a translator's particular faith tradition cause a translation to be rendered in one way or another.

Third, there's the question of whether or not a particular translation contains all the books of the Bible or not. I suppose it goes without saying that we need to know which writings are divinely inspired and which are not, and because God didn't say explicitly upon their completion which books belong to the Bible and which do not, there needs to be some authority for making that determination.

There was no "canon" (or conglomerate collection) of scripture in the Church's earliest centuries; in fact, there was no Bible as we know it. The Church gave birth to the Bible, and not the other way around. The truth is that the Bible is the book of the Church; she is not the Church of the Bible. It was the Church—both in her leadership and in her faithful people—guided as she was by the authority of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Truth came to discover which the books were inspired by God in their writing. The Church did not *create* the canon of Scripture; she *discerned* it.

The canon of books of the Holy Bible dates back to the mid-300s and the Council of Laodicea. Numerous reaffirmations of that canon were made throughout the history of the Church. However, because the Catholic Church does not tend to make rules definitive unless errors abound, the canon of Scripture was not defined until the Council of Trent. There was a need to do that because so many Protestant leaders were leaving books out of the Bible, and it was leading to confusion for the faithful.

There are 46 books in the Old Testament and 27 books in the New Testament. Christians are in agreement about which books of the New Testament are divinely inspired. However, Protestant and Evangelical canons generally lack seven of the Old Testament books, specifically the ones which were written in Greek. These books were rejected by Protestants, even though they had been accepted as part of the canon of Sacred Scripture for more than a thousand years of Christianity and are, namely: Baruch, Judith, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Sirach, Tobit and Wisdom. These are generally referred to collectively as the "Apocrypha" or the "Apocryphal Books." Sometimes a bible will have a notation below the title "with Apocrypha" or "Catholic Edition," which means that none of the books of the Bible are omitted.

Next time, we'll look at some traits of particular translations. Until then, God bless and keep you.
