**MASSES THIS WEEKEND:
PATRONAL FEAST TAKES PRECEDENCE
AT ST. ANTHONY;
LITURGICAL BUSINESS AS USUAL
AT ST. JOSEPH**

My Dear Brother and Sisters in the Faith,

A little explanation of how the Church Calendar works is in order this weekend. There's a whole system of how celebrating feasts works. It can get fairly complicated, but I'll try to keep it as straightforward as possible.

In our everyday lives, some celebrations are more important than others. Birthdays of family members tend to be a pretty big deal, but even within those, we have certain "milestone" birthdays that take on more significance. An immediate family member's birthday is most likely going to be more significant to us than a more distant relative.

The same is true in our civil lives. Certain national holidays—like Christmas, Thanksgiving, Memorial Day, Independence Day, or Labor Day are more likely to be of importance to us than Flag Day or Washington's Birthday.

The same is true of the Church Year. Some feasts are more important, some less. This gives rise to a whole hierarchy of how to determine how to celebrate and when. Our religious celebrations are given certain rankings. In descending order of ecclesial rank these categories are, namely, solemnities, feasts, memorials, and optional memorials.

A celebration of a saint's feast day can fall into any of those categories. Let's take Our Lady for an example. (She's always a good example!) Some of her celebrations are solemnities, like Mary, Mother of God, her Immaculate Conception, and her Assumption. Some of her days have the rank of "feast," including the Visitation of Mary, The Nativity of Mary, and Our Lady of Guadalupe. Still others are memorials, such as the Immaculate Heart of Mary and Our Lady of the Rosary. Finally, there are those that are optional memorials which may be celebrated or not. These include, for example, Our Lady of Lourdes and the Holy Name of Mary.

While this may seem a little Byzantine in its complexity, it's really an example of the Church's flexibility. Like a mother or father who adapts parenting skills to the needs of each child, so the Church adapts to divergent cultures and congregations. Mother Church recognized that the degree of importance afforded a particular feast or celebration may vary from place to place. Sometimes history or ethnicity play a part in determining the level of festivity we might devote to a particular celebration.

For most of us, most of the time, we can simply consult the church calendar that is made available every Advent, but this is not always sufficient for every time and circumstance.

Local patronage can be a factor as well.

That's the case this weekend.

During Ordinary Time (that is, time outside of the Seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter) Sundays take precedence over everything except solemnities. (There are a few exceptions to this, but I promised to keep it as simple as possible). If a solemnity falls on a Sunday in Ordinary time—like the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (June 24) or the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul (June 29), the solemnity takes precedence over that particular Sunday in Ordinary Time that year.

Here's where it gets a little tricky. If there's a patron of a particular place, parish, or institution, that celebration is raised to

the rank of a solemnity for that particular group of people.

June 13th is the Feast of St. Anthony of Padua in the Calendar of the Catholic Church. Because he is the principal patron of St. Anthony Parish, this feast is raised to the rank of solemnity in that parish and for all its members, wherever they may be. And, as I pointed out a few paragraphs ago, when a celebration has the rank of "solemnity," it takes precedence over a Sunday in Ordinary Time. However, because he is not the principal patron of St. Joseph parish, his memorial is not celebrated as a solemnity there.

When a celebration has the rank of a "solemnity" or a "feast" there are some liturgical ramifications. For example, the Entrance and Communion Antiphons are "proper"—which means that they're selected particularly for the occasion, they're not the "common" ones that are ordinarily used on that day. Additionally, the readings and the responsorial psalm are also proper for that celebration.

One might ask why the liturgy for the Solemnity of St. Joseph is celebrated the same whether we're at St. Joseph Parish or St. Anthony Parish. That's because St. Joseph's Day has the rank of "solemnity" for the whole church. Wherever you go on that day, the entire Catholic Church celebrates that solemnity. However, I'd also point out that the Solemnity of St. Joseph always falls during Lent or Easter. So, when March 19 falls on a Sunday, his Solemnity is moved to the nearest "free" day, because during the Seasons, the Seasonal Sunday takes precedence even over a Solemnity of a saint.

Do not pass "Go," do not collect \$200.

This may all seem a little involved; maybe it's more information than you bargained for. However, if someone wonders why the liturgy is celebrated differently (with two different homilies, I might add) in our two Catholic parishes in Fredonia this weekend, that's the reason. The Church Year is, after all, a sacramental, and it can be good for Catholics to have some grasp of how our celebrations are determined.
