



#### DIOCESE SCHEDULES PRO-LIFE ACTIVITES IN ERIE COUNTY

Due to the Covid pandemic, there will not be a diocesan trip to Washington, D.C., for the March for Life this year. Instead the Office of Pastoral Ministries will host two Masses with Bishop Fisher.

On Saturday, Jan. 15, the "Pro-Vita" Mass will be held at St. Joseph Cathedral in downtown Buffalo beginning at 4:30 p.m.

During the Mass, the diocesan Office of Pro-Life Ministries will present the annual "Pro-Vita" Awards. These awards are intended to recognize people who have labored tirelessly for the pro-life cause and to give them strength, encouragement and support.

On Saturday, Jan. 22, Bishop Fisher will celebrate a Youth Mass at St. Gregory the Great Parish in Williamsville at 5:30 p.m. *(See separate article about this event.)* Light refreshments will follow Mass.

St. Leo the Great Parish invites all to a Prayer Vigil for Life at 3 p.m. on Saturday, Jan. 22, outside the Amherst church to recognize the 49th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision to deny legal protection to unborn people.

#### YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH EXTENDED IN BUFFALO DIOCESE

Bishop Fisher has extended the Year of St. Joseph in the Diocese of Buffalo to mark the 175th Anniversary of the establishment of the Diocese. St. Joseph has been the principal patron of the Diocese since its foundation on April 23, 1847.

As part of the observance, each parish has been asked to host a day of prayer. More information about these days will be forthcoming once definite dates have been approved by the diocesan officials in charge of such matters.

#### ROAD TO RENEWAL FINALIZES "FAMILIES OF PARISHES"

Part to the Diocese's "Road to Renewal" plan/program has been to group parishes in to "families of parishes." St. Joseph and St. Anthony parishes have been grouped with the parishes of Northeastern Chautauqua County, which includes Dunkirk, Silver Creek, and Forestville in addition to Fredonia. In addition, the Diocese has divided this "family" into subfamilies A and B. The Dunkirk parishes form one subfamily and the parishes of Forestville, Fredonia, and Silver Creek comprise another subfamily. It is not yet specified what the particular ramifications are pertinent to the division of subfamilies versus being a member of the whole family, but more information will be shared in the parish bulletin as soon as this is specified/ clarified by the Diocese.
