PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends in Christ:

Today is the feast of the **Epiphany of the Lord** when God's glory is revealed. We usually assume the Epiphany refers to the Magi from the East who follow a star that leads them to Bethlehem to pay homage to the new born king of the Jews. Traditionally, there are two other epiphanies associated with January 6th – the Twelfth Day of Christmas: the Baptism of Jesus at the Jordan River and the Wedding Feast at Cana when Jesus changes water into wine. On this Sunday January 2,



2022, as we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany, the Deacon proclaims the upcoming feasts of the Liturgical Year starting with Easter. The date of Easter determines the Seasons of Lent and Easter, Ordinary Time and the First Sunday of Advent which begins the New Church Year 2023. The public oral proclamation was an ancient custom necessary before printed church calendars were distributed at Mass. I express our apperception to **Chris Kloc and Kloc Blossom Chapels, Inc. for providing our parish calendars.**

Bishop Mike Fisher has written a Pastoral Letter on the one year anniversary of his coming to the Diocese of Buffalo. It is entitled, **"Our Road to Renewal: Our Journey Toward Holiness."** It is available at the entrances to church. He reflects on our Synodal Journey, Care and Concern for Those in Need, Eucharistic Revival, and Journey toward Holiness. I share with you his closing words:

"And so my brothers and sisters of our family of faith here in the Diocese of Buffalo, I implore you to seize this unique moment in the life of our Church to engage in the work of renewing and redefining our Catholic faith individually and collectively on the Road to Renewal and by participating in the journey of the universal Synod now underway. No one engaged in this journey travels alone. We support and sustain one another and together will overcome whatever obstacles we encounter along the way. Although the course at times may be unsteady and even uncertain, our destination is clear: Jesus Christ - His way, His truth and His life. So honored as I am and forever grateful to the Lord for the gift to serve you as your pastor and shepherd, I am also your fellow traveler, who wishes to assure you of my commitment to support you, to listen and to learn from you, and to share whatever gifts I may have to complement your own. Evoking the words of St. Paul in his letter to the Hebrews: "... Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken His seat at the right hand of the throne of God. ... Pursue peace with everyone, and the holiness without which no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springs up and causes trouble..." (Hebrews 12: 1-2; 14-15). May God's immense and abiding love inspire us always to seek the good of one another and reveal at every opportunity His Holy Spirit living and working among us!"

As your pastor, I express my appreciation for your continuing support of the church and our parish mission. I thank you for your kindness to me. As the Bishop says above, I am your fellow traveler. May we enter this new calendar year 2022 with hope and confidence of knowing God is true to his promises and always with us in Jesus Christ. I end with the blessing of Aaron in the Book of Numbers, *"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord's face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord look upon you kindly and give you peace."* (Numbers 6:22-27)

FAMILY CONNECTION

The tradition of giving gifts at Christmas is thought by some to be rooted in the gift giving of the Magi. In many cultures, gifts are not exchanged at Christmas, but rather on the feast of the Epiphany. Whenever you exchange your Christmas gifts, take some time to reflect on this tradition of gift giving at Christmas. Think of the best gift you have received. What was it? What made it special? Was it the gift itself, the thought that went into it, or the person who gave it to you?

Read today's Gospel, Matthew 2:1-12. The gifts of the Magi-gold, frankincense, and myrrh—have come to be understood as symbols of Christ's royalty, divinity, and eventual suffering and death. They are special because in giving them, the Magi acknowledge who Jesus was to be: our Savior. We pray that we will acknowledge Jesus as Savior in all that we do and say. Conclude by singing together "We Three Kings."
