

# LITURGICAL LIFE

### PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends in Christ:

**"The Twelve Days of Christmas"** is an English Christmas Carol. The lyrics were first published in the late eighteenth century. There are a number of melodies associated with the song, of which, the best known is derived from a 1909 arrangement of a traditional folk melody by English composer Frederic Austin. The Twelve Day span begins on Christmas December 25 and runs to the Epiphany January 6 when the Church celebrates the arrival of the Magi in Bethlehem. There is an ancient



custom (before printed calendars) of publicly announcing the date of Easter on the feast of the Epiphany. Days and Seasons of the liturgical year depend on the dating of Easter. The Epiphany Proclamation still has value as a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated during the year. If you missed hearing the public Epiphany Proclamation at Sunday Masses on January 2, 2022, you can read it below.

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior. On the second day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the seventeenth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-sixth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the fifth day of June, the feast of Pentecost. On the nineteenth day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the twenty-seventh day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ,

to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Today, **Sunday, January 9, 2022 is the Baptism of the Lord.** This feast closes the Christmas season. Monday, January 10, 2022 begins Ordinary Time. "Ordinary Time is not very ordinary at all. Ordinary Time, the celebration of Sunday, is the identifying mark of the Christian community which comes together, remembering that on the first day of the week the Lord of Life was raised up and creation came at last to completion. Sunday as a day of play and worship is a sacrament of redeemed time. How we live Sunday proclaims to the world what we believe about redeemed time now and forever. What happens in our churches every Sunday is the fruit of our week. What happens as the fruit of the week past is the beginning of the week to come. Sunday, like all Sacraments, is simultaneously a point of arrival and departure for Christians on their way to the fullness of the kingdom. This is not ordinary at all. This is the fabric of Christian living." (Ordo page 34) Most of Jesus' life, from infancy to twelve years and from twelve to thirty-some when he was baptized, was ordinary and hidden. As we move from the Christmas season to ordinary time we need to remember that Jesus continues to walk with us in the daily routine of life which he has sanctified by his own life and abiding presence.



# FAITH FORMATION

## FAMILY CONNECTION

Every family has a unique identity that is defined by the behaviors, attitudes, and expectations that govern a family's daily life. This identity is influenced by the family history of the parents, but each family's expression of this history is unique. In today's Gospel, we learn that Jesus' behavior, attitudes, and expectations were governed by his identity as God's beloved Son. In our Baptism, we were made children of this same heavenly Father. This identity as members of the family of God, and as brothers and sisters of Jesus, also shapes our family's daily life.

As you gather as a family, identify some of the expectations and behaviors that govern your family life by answering the question, "What are some of the things that make our family life unique?" Celebrate these things about your family life. Read today's Gospel, Luke 3:15-16,21-22. Observe that Jesus' identity as the Beloved Son of the Father governed his behaviors, attitudes, and expectations. Recall that at our Baptism we were made children of this same heavenly Father. How does this identity as a member of the family of God govern and shape our family life? Conclude in prayer together that we will remain faithful to our baptismal identity as children of God and as brothers or sisters of Jesus. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer.
