

LITURGICAL LIFE

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends in Christ:

Our Gospel today is from St. John - the **wedding feast at Cana in Galilee.** The mother of Jesus is present and, on the third day of the celebration, she brings the concern, "They have no wine" to her son Jesus. Jesus replies, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." Mary does not reply directly to Jesus but says to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Mary's role in the Church is the same. She brings our concerns to Jesus and reminds us to do whatever he tells us. But before we can do what Jesus tells us to do we must listen to Jesus! Listening is key.



The Catholic Church is planning for a **Synod at the Vatican.** Pope Francis has made "synodality" the topic of the Synod. For many Catholics, synods are for Bishops and Cardinals like what happened at the 2nd Vatican Council. Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium." "Synodality" means "common road." We are all travelers. The Church, by reflecting on our journey, will be able to learn through Sacred Scripture, Catholic Tradition and our shared experiences, the path forward to live communion, to achieve participation, and to open ourselves to mission.

Our **Pastoral Council** is a key consultative body where we listen together. At every meeting we take time to break open the Word and be nourished by the Sunday Gospel and to pray together for the guidance of the Holy Spirit. This "listening" to Jesus has enabled us to focus our attention on the vision and mission of our parish. The fruit of our discussion will be apparent in two upcoming events. **During the month of February, one Mass each weekend, there will be a narration.** People are desiring to know the meaning of different parts of the Mass to better understand the Eucharist. Later in the spring we are planning a **Safety Sunday** to keep our parishioners and visitors informed on health and safety measures in place to ensure our wellbeing when we assemble for worship, faith formation and social gatherings.

All parishes are embarking on the **Road to Renewal and establishing Families of Parishes.** The first or "pilot" phase includes five parishes in our Eastern Erie Vicariate: St. Mary on the Hill, Our Lady of Pompeii, Saint Teresa of Calcutta, St. Philip the Apostle and Sacred Heart of Jesus. We will hear soon enough the challenges they are facing and their success drawing closer as a Family. Parishes are not islands unto themselves. Our sense of Church must be wider than narrow parochial boundaries and interests.

We continue living with the omicron variant of Covid 19. **Bishop Mike Fisher asks us to continue to wear masks at Mass for our safety and the safety of others.** I received a Christmas card from a couple I met years ago on vacation. Sandy and Paul were young and recently married. Now they are grandparents. Sandy is in the second year of her remission from cancer. Both are vaccinated and they choose to go to weekend Masses that are less attended and avoid any public gathering where people are not wearing face masks. Thank you for wearing a face mask for your own sake and for the wellbeing of others with compromising health issues. We are weary of the pandemic. We choose to wear a face mask, not as a political statement or following the science that can be confusing, but for our genuine concern for all members of the Body of Christ.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint. But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom. Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word? Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

NARRATED MASSES

The meaning of the word "liturgy" is "public worship" and it is also sometimes called the work of the people. Under this heading we will find the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. These two parts make up the central prayer of the Catholic Church, the Mass. Our Pastoral Council and Liturgy Committee has asked for a renewal of our understanding of the Mass as a parish. During Ordinary Time in February, Fr. Gene will offer one narrated Mass each weekend, describing the meaning and action of the prayers. The dates and time are as follows: February 5 at 5 PM, February 13 at 8 AM, February 20 at 11 AM and February 27 at 5 PM. Also, at each of the narrated Masses you will be able to pick up a small pamphlet called Understanding the Mass which will remind you of the teaching you have received. The Second Vatican Council brought a renewed emphasis on the role of the assembly in worship and asked the Church to pray in the Mass with full and active participation. Through this narrated Mass we hope to impart a deeper understanding of our relationship to each other and with the Divine.




