PASTOR’S COLUMN

LOOK TO LENT

Lent is coming upon us. Ash Wednesday is on February 17. The Ordinary Time Season is interrupted at this point and as a universal, Catholic Church, we all go on retreat together. We all need this retreat. The world needs this retreat. What we do in Lent not only has an impact on us, individually, but it should also have an impact on those around us. So now is the time to get ready and to be prepared.

WHAT IS A RETREAT?

I use this word all the time in reference to Lent. My apologies if I never explained it. Recently, some have asked me to define what a retreat is, since it is outside of their experience. As your priest, I need a retreat, and I have the luxury to build it into my yearly schedule. I normally retreat with a priest friend of mine (Fr. Dale Staysniak from St. Anthony of Padua Parish, Parma – my second assignment as a Parochial Vicar). We drive to Pine City, New York to Mount Saviour Monastery to join the Benedictine monks in their routine of prayer, eating, and silence. The monastery environment is rather stark. They are in a very rural part of New York, outside of Corning and next door to the town of Elmira (where Mark Twain is buried and it is also referred to by the accountant in the movie, “It’s a Wonderful Life.”). The monks raise sheep and honeybees. We pray with the monks at Eucharist and at the Liturgy of the Hours (the praying of Psalms and the sanctification of time) at various moments of the day and night. We eat with them, and we eat what they eat – very simple meals, nothing fancy. Then, there is the silence, the stillness. Outside of retreat, I have a rather full schedule and much to think about and comprehend on a regular basis. To pull myself out of this and to go into silence and stillness is exhausting. The first day or two is usually meant for rest and some sort of “detox” from the busyness and business of life. That eases its way into reflective prayer with the psalms, with the daily Scripture readings, with a Gospel, or with a spiritual book that I brought along. I then like to write down my thoughts or note the encouraging lines or hopeful statements from my reading. I like to make permanent in a notebook the things that inspire me. I do this so that when I am back in the regular routine and sometimes feel at a loss for inspiration, I can go back to those retreat thoughts or those retreat notes and gain some wisdom once again. Retreat is also a time to catch up with God. In any relationship – marriage, siblings, or friends – there maybe regular interaction, however, sometimes you need the time to just cast away the distractions, sit down, and talk – and to really talk. We need that in our relationship with God as well. At the end of about five days of retreat, the end result is always different. Sometimes I come back thinking that I have the next steps to my ministry in place. Sometimes I come out of retreat just well rested. Sometimes I leave retreat with a sense of having spent time loving and being loved by God. There are other results, but those are the big ones. Retreat is necessary. I even know married couples who do this on a regular basis. It may not be a week, but at least a few days, where they go away together to enter into retreat time – either apart from each other or with each other. I think everyone should experience retreat at some point and even regularly.

THE LENTEN RETREAT

In a sense we do experience retreat – it’s called Lent. Everything that I just described above is what Lent is. It is a special time set aside. We retreat and surrender our busyness and business, with the intention of entering a different time to be more fully in relationship with God. Universally, as Catholics, we do this in solidarity with each other. This is expressed especially through our acts

of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and through our act of abstaining from meat every Friday. This simple practice, is a way for us to become very conscious that we are in a different time. We are in God's retreat time. Being conscious of what we eat and even creating a hunger within us and even saying “no” to what we normally want for ourselves by way of eating anything and at any time, helps us to be more conscious that we are on a different time, not my time, but God's times. It also helps us to know that we do this together, as Catholics. We do this together so that together we can grow in our faith and in holiness.

CHRIS STEIN; SEMINARIAN REFLECTION

In the Gospel for this week we are brought face to face with the power and authority of Jesus. The unclean spirit rendered powerless and defenseless when confronted by the presence of Jesus. This dark spirit, who himself worked to destroy, enslave, entrap, and bring suffering to the possessed man, can do nothing but submit as Jesus commands the spirits' departure.

It is worth pondering over our belief in Jesus' power. Do we believe that Jesus has power and authority over our lives? The question of the authority of Jesus contains a frightfulness because answering in the affirmative means that we are powerless and must approach Jesus in awe and humility. It demands our own surrender to the power of Jesus, the placing of ourselves under His authority.

Along with the frightfulness, however, we also can see a great hopefulness. If Jesus has the power to cast out this unclean spirit, he also has the power to cast out our demons. He has the power and authority to grant us true freedom from those things that seek to bind us. Jesus' power and sharing of His grace sets us free from Satan and the demons of hell. Jesus' gift of freedom offers us the opportunity to be set free from our sins, struggles, and failures. There is nothing that we will ever face that cannot be overcome by the power of Christ.

In some way, whether it is great or small, each of us needs to be freed from something. Maybe we have a vice, or an attachment, or a sin that keeps us from growing closer to God. Perhaps, we need to receive the freedom of Christ to forgive an old friend or family member, to break an addiction, to love a spouse better, to put more effort into our jobs and tasks.

As Lent approaches, take time to think about an area in life where we need to experience freedom and redemption. Once discovered, make an active plan to cooperate in letting Christ grant you freedom and redemption, healing and mercy. The Church regularly, but especially during the season of Lent, calls on us to actively engage in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. This Lent let us form our sacrifices and works toward being set free by Christ.

May Christ set us free!

NAVIGATOR NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL

Preschool Alphabet Practice – Ms. Charlotte Thomas’ Preschool students recently enjoyed practicing their letters and shapes in a very tactile way. By combining ice, water and paint in a plastic bag, they each had their own sensory canvas on which to trace the letters of the alphabet and various shapes.

2nd Grade Pine Cone Experiment – Ms. Leanna Guelker’s 2nd grade students conducted a pine cone experiment in Science class last week. They placed pine cones in three jars, one with cold water, one with hot water, and one with just air, and observed how the pine cones were affected. The students were surprised to see that the water also changed as a result of the pine cone.

4th Grade Experiments with Matter – In Science class with Mrs. Diane Thomas, the 4th grade has been learning about Matter. The students conducted experiments to explore volume, density, weight, area, and buoyancy. They then created flip books to share their hypotheses and the actual results of the experiments.

2nd Grade Symmetrical Snowflakes – In their Maker Space class last week, the 2nd grade learned about symmetry. After discussing the concept and identifying shapes and objects that are symmetrical, the students created their own symmetrical snowflake designs using Q-tips and paper.




